

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 April 2009

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of April 2009.

Overview Consumer Price Indices

- The CPI for April 2009 is 109.27, an increase of 0.28% compared to the index of March 2009 (108.96).
- The percentage change for the first 4 months (January to April 2009) of the CPI is 1.29, compared to 2.73 for the same period of last year.
- The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (April 2008 to April 2009) is -3.23, a decrease of 13.28 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (10.05).
- The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period April 2008 - April 2009 is 4.59, a decrease of 2.83 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period April 2007 - April 2008 (7.42).

Monthly Percentage Change

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to March 2009, 40.9% of these products had an increase in price, while 21.5% showed a decrease and the remaining 37.6% had no change in price.

The prices of all products (goods and services) in the consumption basket of the CPI show an increase of 0.28% for the month of April 2009 compared to the prices observed in March 2009.

The prices of goods increased by 0.41% and caused an influence of 0.26 ppts on the percentage change of the CPI. The prices of services show also an increase (0.05%) and had an influence of 0.02 ppts on the CPI.

In April 2009, the sectors that had the greatest influence on the percentage change of the CPI are:


- Transport (0.09), where an increase in prices was registered in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" and a decrease in prices was registered in the category "Transport services".
- Restaurants and hotels (0.05), where an increase in prices was registered in the category "Catering services".
- Housing (0.05), where an increase in prices was mainly registered in the category "Actual rentals for housing".
- Food and non-alcoholic beverages (0.04), where an increase in prices was mainly registered in the category "Non-alcoholic beverages".
- Household operation (0.04), where increases in prices were registered in the categories "Furniture, furnishings, carpets and other floor coverings" and "Household textiles".

Communications (0.02), where an increase in prices was registered in the category "Telephone and telefax equipment".

Graph 1 shows that the monthly percentage change of the CPI decreased by 0.30 ppts to 0.28 in April of 2009 from 0.58 in April of 2008.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities and gasoline in April 2009

The prices of utilities (electricity and water supply), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In April 2009 the average price of crude oil increased by US\$ 4.17 per barrel compared to March.

Fuel surcharge did not change in April, it stayed at Afl. 15.42 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change either compared to March 2009. The average electricity price remained at Afl. 225.94, while the price of water remained at Afl. 120.24.

The price of gasoline shows for the third month in a row an increase in price. In April 2009 it increased by Afl. 0.05 (3.13%) causing an effect of 0.15 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an insignificant decrease (-0.16%) in April 2009.

In April 2009, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in prices of 0.94% compared to March 2009, and had an influence of 0.15 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in prices of 0.16%, causing an effect of 0.13 ppts on the CPI.
