

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 March 2010

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of March 2010.

Overview Consumer Price Indices

- The CPI for March 2010 is 114.39, an increase of 0.25% compared to the index of February 2010 (114.10).
- The percentage change for the first 3 months of 2010 (January to March) of the CPI is -0.69, 1.70 percentage points (ppts) lower compared to 1.01 for the same period of last year.
- The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (March 2009 to March 2010) is 4.98, an increase of 7.92 ppts compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-2.94).
- The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period March 2009 - March 2010 is -0.09, a decrease of 5.80 ppts compared to the period average percentage change for the period March 2008 - March 2009 (5.71).

Monthly Percentage Change

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to February 2010, 22.8% of these products had an increase in price, while 46.2% showed a decrease and the remaining 31.0% had no change in price.

The prices of all products (goods and services) in the consumption basket of the CPI show an increase of 0.25% for the month of March 2010 compared to the prices observed in February 2010.

The prices of goods increased by 0.34% and caused an influence of 0.22 ppts on the CPI. The prices of services show also an increase (0.09%) and had an influence of 0.03 ppts on the CPI.

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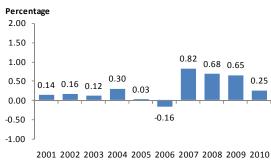
In March 2010, the sectors that had the greatest influence on the percentage change of the CPI are:

- Housing (0.78), where increases in prices were registered in the categories "Electricity, gas and other fuels", "Water supply and miscellaneous services relating to the dwelling" and "Actual rentals for housing".
- Transport (-0.26), where decreases in prices were registered in the categories "Purchase of vehicles" and "Operation of personal transport equipment".
- Clothing and footwear (-0.13), where a decrease in prices was mainly registered in the category "Clothing".
- Restaurants and hotels (-0.04), where a decrease in prices was mainly registered in the category "Catering services".

Graph 1 shows that the monthly percentage change of the CPI decreased by 0.40 ppts to 0.25 in March of 2010 from 0.65 in March of 2009.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in March 2010

The prices of utilities (electricity and water supply), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In March 2010 the average price of crude oil per barrel (US\$ 77.56) increased by US\$ 4.52 (+6.19%) compared to February 2010 (US\$ 73.04).

Fuel surcharge shows in March an increase of Afl. 2.64 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water show also increases in price compared to February 2010. The average electricity price per household increased to Afl. 318.66 (+6.39%) causing an effect of 0.55 ppts on the CPI, while the average price of water per household increased to Afl. 162.26 (+3.75%) causing an effect of 0.20 ppts on the CPI.

In March 2010 the price of gasoline decreased by Afl. 0.02 (-1.09%) causing an effect of -0.06 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an insignificant decrease (-1.43%) in March 2010.

In March 2010, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 3.45% compared to February 2010, and had an influence of 0.69 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price (0.54%), causing an effect of -0.43 ppts on the CPI.
