

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 February 2012

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of February 2012.

The CPI for February 2012 is 121.48, an increase of 0.39% compared of January 2012 (121.01) and accumulating an increase of 0.11% up to and including February of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (February 2011 to February 2012) is 5.58, an increase of 4.74 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.84).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period February 2011 - February 2012 is 5.18, an increase of 3.95 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period February 2010 - February 2011 (1.23).

During this month, eight of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (1.77%) and "Housing" (0.24%) sectors, causing an effect of respectively 0.31 and 0.08 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.14 ppts on the CPI of February 2012.


Aforementioned increases were partially offset by decreases in the indices for the "Clothing and footwear" (-1.91%) and "Household operation" (-0.29%) sectors, which together had an influence of -0.13 ppts.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (3.33%), which contributed to an effect of 0.31 ppts. The increase in the "Housing" sector was caused by increases in the categories "Maintenance and repair of the dwelling" (1.21%) and "Actual rentals for housing" (0.29%), which together contributed to an effect of 0.08 ppts.

The decrease in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was mainly caused by a decrease of 1.85% in the category "Clothing", which contributed to an effect of -0.09 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to January 2012, 40.7% of these products had an increase in price, while 34.3% showed a decrease and the remaining 25.0% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.39% and caused an influence of 0.25 ppts. The prices of services show an increase of 0.41% and had an influence of 0.14 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in February 2012 an increase of 2.17%, which is 2.89 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.72%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered an increase of 15.18%, which is 4.86 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (10.32%). The food index shows an increase of 5.20%, which is 7.01 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-1.81%).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in February 2012

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In February 2012 the average price per barrel (US\$ 101.32) of crude oil had an increase of US\$ 0.79 (0.79%) compared to January 2012 (US\$ 100.53).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh surcharge did not change in February 2012, it stayed at Afl. 32.49 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity above 500 kWh surcharge did not change either in February 2012, it stayed at Afl. 38.47 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to January 2012. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 363.27, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 195.47.

In February 2012 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.11 (4.79%) causing an effect of 0.29 ppts on the CPI of February 2012. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 0.08 (3.82%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of February 2012.

In February 2012, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 1.35% compared to January 2012, and had an influence of 0.31 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.11%, causing an effect of 0.09 ppts on the CPI.
