

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 April 2012

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of April 2012.

The CPI for April 2012 is 121.88, an increase of 0.09% compared to the index of March 2012 (121.77) and accumulating an increase of 0.43% up to and including April of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (April 2011 to April 2012) is 2.60, a decrease of 0.87 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (3.47).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period April 2011 - April 2012 is 5.42, an increase of 4.60 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period April 2010 - April 2011 (0.82).

During this month, four of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increase which had the greatest influence on the CPI was registered for the "Transport" sector (1.12%), causing an effect of 0.20 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of April 2012.


Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by a decrease in the index for the "Recreation and culture" sector (-0.58%), which had an influence of -0.05 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of -0.07 ppts on the CPI of April 2012.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (2.98%), which contributed to an effect of 0.29 ppts.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly caused by a decrease of 5.64% in the category "Holidays", which contributed to an effect of -0.04 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to March 2012, 33.9% of these products had an increase in price, while 33.4% showed a decrease and the remaining 32.7% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.32% and caused an influence of 0.21 ppts. The prices of services show a decrease of 0.34% and had an influence of -0.12 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in April 2012 an increase of 2.17%, which is 2.71 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.54%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered an increase of 16.10%, which is 9.52 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (6.58%). The food index shows an increase of 5.43%, which is 6.19 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.76%).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in April 2012

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In April 2012 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 103.25) had a decrease of US\$ 3.05 (-2.87%) compared to March 2012 (US\$ 106.30).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh surcharge did not change in April 2012, it stayed at Afl. 32.49 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity above 500 kWh surcharge did not change either in April 2012, it stayed at Afl. 38.47 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to March 2012. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 363.27, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 195.47.

In April 2012 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.10 (4.25%) causing an effect of 0.29 ppts on the CPI of April 2012. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 0.02 (1.10%).

In April 2012, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 1.25% compared to March 2012, and had an influence of 0.29 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.26%, causing an effect of -0.20 ppts on the CPI.
