

#### Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 September 2012

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of September 2012.

The CPI for September 2012 is 119.38, an increase of 0.45% compared to the index of August 2012 (118.85) and accumulating a decrease of 1.63% up to and including September of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (September 2011 to September 2012) is -2.08, a decrease of 8.58 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (6.50).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period September 2011 - September 2012 is 2.87, an increase of 0.22 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period September 2010 - September 2011 (2.65).

During this month, eight of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increase which had the greatest influence on the CPI was registered for the "Transport" sector (2.60%), causing an effect of 0.47 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.10 ppts on the CPI of September 2012.


Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by a decrease in the index for the "Clothing and footwear" sector (-1.69%), which had an influence of -0.09 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of -0.03 ppts on the CPI of September 2012.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (4.94%), which contributed to an effect of 0.47 ppts.

The decrease in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was caused by a decrease of 1.94% in the category "Clothing", which contributed to an effect of -0.09 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to August 2012, 37.8% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.92 ppts, while 34.5% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.47 ppts and the remaining 27.7% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.78% and caused an influence of 0.50 ppts. The prices of services show a decrease of 0.16% and had an influence of -0.06 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in September 2012 an increase of 0.79%, which is 0.06 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.85%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered an increase of 8.64%, which is 0.12 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (8.76%). The food index shows an increase of 4.25%, which is 1.69 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (2.56%).

# Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in September 2012

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In September 2012 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 94.57) had an increase of US\$ 0.86 (0.92%) compared to August 2012 (US\$ 93.71).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh surcharge did not change in September 2012, it stayed at Afl. 32.49 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity above 500 kWh surcharge did not change either in September 2012, it stayed at Afl. 38.47 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to August 2012. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 363.27, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In September 2012 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.16 (7.00%), causing an effect of 0.46 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 0.11 (5.51%) and had an effect of 0.02 ppts on the CPI of September 2012.

In September 2012, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 2.21% compared to August 2012, and had an influence of 0.47 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.04%, causing an effect of -0.03 ppts on the CPI.

#### Change in prices of Food & catering services in September 2012

The "Food & catering services" index increased with 0.23% in September 2012 after decreasing 0.09% in August 2012. The index for "Food at home" shows an increase of 0.27% in September, as eight of the eleven "Food at home" indices increased in September 2012. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest increase (2.61%) in September and was caused by an increase in the index for "Potatoes" (3.82%). The "Vegetables" index increased by 2.41%, after declining 0.61% the previous month. The index for "Fish and other seafood" shows an increase of 0.30%. The index for "Meat" increased by 0.29%, after declining in each of the four previous months. The "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery" index decreased the most (-0.58%), followed by decreases of 0.38% and 0.15% in the indices for "Milk, cheese and eggs" and "Bread and cereals", respectively.

Over the last 12 months the "Food & catering services" index has increased by 1.83%. The "Food at home" index shows an increase of 1.09%. The "Fish and other seafood" index increased by 6.36%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Potatoes and other tubers" index (-13.87%) shows the largest decrease.

In September 2012, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show an increase in price of 0.23% compared to August 2012, and had an influence of 0.04 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.49%, causing an effect of 0.41 ppts on the CPI.
