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

Key points

Consumer prices increased by 0.4 percent in January 2011, compared to a decrease of 0.8 percent in January 2010. With the exception of Clothing & footwear (-0.3%) and Recreation & culture (-1.6%), price increases has been recorded for all sectors, particularly, Alcoholic beverages & tobacco (+8.1%), Transport (+1.4%), Miscellaneous goods & services (+0.6%), Communications (+0.5%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.5%), Health (+0.5%), Restaurants & Hotels (+0.4%), Education (+0.3%), Household operation (+0.2%) and Housing (+0.2%).

On a yearly basis, consumer prices rose with 0.5 percent in January 2011. Major price increases were recorded in the following sectors:

- 1. Housing; Average prices in the Housing sector increased by 2.1 percent compared to January 2010. The main price increases were recorded for Actual rentals for housing (+5.6%) and Electricity, gas & other fuels (+3.0%), while the prices of Maintenance & repair of the dwelling and Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings fell with 2.4 and 1.4 percent respectively.
- 2. *Transport*; In January 2011, prices in the Transport sector rose by 1.5 percent compared to January 2010. The main price increases were recorded for Operation of personal transport equipment (+7.8%).
- 3. Food & non-alcoholic beverages; Prices in this sector increased by 1.6 percent in January 2011. Higher prices were recorded for Food (+1.4%) and Non-alcoholic beverages (+2.9%).



Key points

World crude oil prices is expected to average about \$93 in 2011. In 2012, crude oil price is projected to further increase to an estimated \$98. Keep in mind that there are many significant uncertainties that could push oil prices higher or lower than the current expectations, like decisions of major suppliers regarding production, rate of economic recovery, fiscal issues and political unrest in supplier countries.

As a result of continued tightening expectations of world oil market over the next two years, gasoline and diesel prices is also expected to rise. In the United States, regulargrade gasoline retail prices is expected to rise with 37 dollar cents per gallon compared to 2010 average price.

In the first six months of 2010, outbound air traffic from USA increased by 3.7 percent, when compared to the similar period of 2009. This positive growth can be attributed to increases in the Caribbean market (+4.4%), Asia (+10.1%), South America (+1.0%), Oceania (+17.5%), Middle East (+29.6%) and Africa (+16.5%).



Key points

The average price of water and electricity remained unchanged in January 2011, when compared to the previous month. The price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.10 in January 2011, reaching Afl. 2.07 per liter. In addition, the price of diesel rose with Afl. 0.06 compared to the previous month, reaching an average price of Afl. 1.79 per liter. Average world crude oil prices in January 2011 reached \$ 92.04, up from \$ 87.22 recorded in December 2010.





Key points

During the month of January 2011, the average water distribution (houses, companies, hotels, government) decreased 0.6 percent compared to January 2010. With the exception of Companies (+8.9%), water usage decreases has been recorded for Houses (-2.2%), Hotels (-1.2%) and Government (-2.0%).



Electricity distribution (MWh)



In January 2011, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution declined by 3.4 percent compared to January 2010, in contrast to an increase of 5.0 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the total electricity usage (as reported by the ELMAR N.V.) declined by 5.0 percent compared to the similar period of 2009. Household usage reported a drop of 6.5 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2009.

Average household usage per connection increased by 4.7 percent in January 2011, when compared to the previous month, reaching 613.2 kWh.





Key points

Total import of merchandise increased by 2.6 percent in January 2001, when compared to January 2010. During the similar period one year earlier, total imports declined by 9.8 percent. With the exception of Agriculture products (-9.0%) and Other transportable goods (-2.0%), higher levels of import has been recorded for Mineral, chemical & related products (+1.9%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+2.7%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (+28.3%). On a monthly basis, total import of merchandise dropped by 31.2 percent in January 2011.

In January 2011, total exports increased by 39.5 percent compared to January 2010, following a growth of 103.8 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. With the exception of Agriculture products (+53.7%), export decreases has been recorded for all commodity groups, particularly, Mineral, chemical & related products (-53.1%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-64.1%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (-5.6%) and Other transportable goods (-37.2%).

When excluding the imports from Valero and WEB, one can notice an drop of 5.1 percent in the total imports in January 2011. Mayor decreases were recorded for Agriculture products (-9.0%), Mineral, chemical & related products (-16.6%) and Other transportable goods (-4.9%).



Key points

In January 2011, the total government tax revenue decreased by 6.9 percent compared to January 2010. The Turnover tax fell with 43.0 percent compared to January 2010. In addition, the Taxes on commodities dropped by 42.4 percent, particularly, as a result of decreases in the Excises on gasoline (-99.6%), Excises on beer (-61.9%), Excises on spirits (-63.6%) and Excises on cigarettes (-31.7%). On the other hand, the most notable revenue increases in January 2011 were recorded for Profit tax (+134.8%), Wage tax (+8.9%), Lodging tax (+54.6%) and Motor vehicle tax (+33.3%). In January 2011, excise rates on beer and social contribution rates experienced an increase when compared to the previous months.



Key points

In January 2011, the total number of stayover visitors increased by 5.2 percent compared to January 2010, following a 2.9 percent growth in the similar period one year earlier. Most notable increases were recorded for the visitors from Venezuela (+27.7%), USA (+1.1%), Italy (+126.8%), Colombia (+29.7%), Argentina (+36.0%), the Netherlands (+4.7%), Chile (+235.6%) and Ecuador (+166.7%). The US market represents a share of 64 percent of the total visitor market, followed by the Venezuelan market (9%) and Canada (8%).

On a monthly basis, the total number of visitors to Aruba declined by 3.6 percent in January 2011. Non-residential arrivals, as reported by the Immigration Department, fell with 5.3 percent compared to December 2010. The number of commercial landings dropped by 7.7 percent in January 2011, when compared to the previous month.

In January 2011, the number of cruise passengers increased by 8.7 percent compared to January 2010, in contrast to a drop of 10.0 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier.
