





# CENTRAL BUREAU OF STATISTICS ARUBA AUGUST 2013 IN REVIEW

#### **Highlights August 2013 in Review**

#### **Consumer Prices:**

- Year over year inflation down by 1.1 percent
- Period average inflation at -3.0 percent in August 2013
- Price of gasoline rose by Afl. 0.11 per liter in August 2013
- Average price of diesel up by Afl. 0.07 in August 2013
  - WTI crude oil price reached \$106.57 per barrel
- Brent (Europe) crude oil price at \$111.28 per barrel

#### **Utilities:**

- Total average water distribution up by 5.9 percent
- Average electricity distribution up by 7.9 percent

#### Foreign Trade:

- Import of goods fell wth 8.1 percent in August 2013
- Value of export up by 14.3 percent in August 2013

#### Tourism:

- Total stayover visitors rose by 5.8 percent in August 2013
- U.S. visitors up by 8.9 percent in August 2013
- Visitors from Venezuela increased by 6.4 percent
- Cruise passengers up by 85.9 percent in August 2013

#### **Airport and Passenger Traffic:**

- Commercial landings down by 1.4 percent in August 2013

#### **Key points**

In August 2013, the total consumer price index increased by 0.1 percent compared to the previous month. With the exception of Health (-0.5%), Recreation & culture (-0.5%), Clothing & footwear (-1.6%) and Alcoholic beverages & tobacco (-0.2%), price increases were recorded for the sectors Transport (+1.0%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.4%) and Miscellaneous goods & services (+0.2%). At the end of August 2013, the twelve-month average rate of inflation was at -3.0 percent, down from 3.6 percent recorded at the end of August 2012.

On a yearly basis, consumer prices declined by 1.1 percent in August 2013. Major price decreases were recorded in the following sectors:

- 1. <u>Housing</u>; In August 2013, average prices in the Housing sector decreased by 4.6 percent compared to August 2012, particularly as a result of decreases in the prices of Electricity, gas & other fuels (-15.4%). On the other hand, the Actual rentals for housing and Maintenance & repair of dwellings increased by 1.7 and 1.4 percent respectively.
- 2. <u>Clothing & footwear;</u> Prices of Clothing & footwear fell with 7.4 percent in August 2013, when compared to August 2012. This is mainly caused by decreases in the average prices of Clothing (-7.2%) and Footwear (-9.0%).
- 3. <u>Household operation</u>; Average prices in the Household operation sector declined by 1.2 percent in August 2013. Lower prices were recorded for Furniture, furnishings, carpets & other floor coverings (-6.0%), Household textiles (-9.8%), Household appliances (-2.4%) and Glassware, tableware & household utensils (-3.7%).





#### **Key points**

In August 2013, the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.11 per liter compared to July 2013, reaching Afl. 2.39 per liter. In addition, the average price of diesel rose by Afl. 0.07 per liter, reaching Afl. 2.04 per liter in August 2013. The average prices per household of water and electricity remained unchanged when compared to the previous month.



#### **Key points**

In August 2013, the average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) rose by 5.9 percent compared to August 2012. With the exception of Hotels (-2.6%), water usage increases has been recorded for all sectors, particularly, Houses (+8.3%), Companies (+15.9%) and Government (+1.6%).

In the January-to-August period of 2013, the average water distribution fell with 0.2 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.




#### **Key points**

In August 2013, electricity in MWh supplied to Elmar increased by 7.9 percent compared to August 2012, in contrast to a decrease of 8.5 percent recorded during the similar period one year earlier.





#### **Key points**

In August 2013, the total import of merchandise to Aruba declined by 8.1 percent compared to August 2012. With the exception of Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+5.8%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (+11.3%) and Other transportable goods (+1.7%), import decreases were recorded for Agriculture products (-29.3%) and Mineral, chemical & related products (-6.5%).

In the January-to-August period of 2013, the total import of goods to Aruba rose by 2.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

Compared to August 2012, the total exports of goods from Aruba expanded by 14.3 percent in August 2013. With the exception of Agriculture products (-1.0%), Mineral, chemical & related products (-80.8%) and Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-38.4%), export increases have been recorded for Other transportable goods (+465.7%) and Metal products, machinery & equipment (+92.5%).

In the January-to-August period of 2013, total export of goods from Aruba increased by 10.8 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.



#### **Key points**

In August 2013, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba increased by 5.8 percent compared to August 2012. Increases were recorded for visitors from the US (+8.9%), Venezuela (+6.4%), Brazil (+41.4%) and Italy (+36.9%).

#### Year to date

In the January-to-August period of 2013, the total number of visitors to Aruba increased by 5.9 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

The share of the US market fell from 61.7 percent in August 2012 to 60.9 percent in August 2013. The Venezuelan market, the second largest market, recorded a market share of 15.1 percent in August 2013, up from 13.6 percent recorded in August 2012.

On a year to date basis, the number of cruise passengers in August 2013 is running 19.2 percent above the level recorded during the similar period of 2012.
