#### **Highlights March 2013 in Review**

#### **Consumer Prices:**

- Year over year inflation down by 3.5 percent
- Period average inflation at -1.6 percent in March 2013
- Price of gasoline up by Afl. 0.14 per liter in March 2013
- Average price of diesel rose by Afl. 0.08 in March 2013

#### Key points

In March 2013, the total consumer price index declined by 0.1 percent compared to the previous month. With the exception of Transport (+1.5%), Restaurants & hotels (+0.1%), Miscellaneous goods & services (+0.1%) and Housing (+0.1%), decreases in average prices have been recorded for Recreation & culture (-2.1%), Clothing & footwear (-1.5%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (-0.5%), Health (-0.4%), Alcoholic beverages & tobacco (-0.3%), Household operation (-0.3%) and Communications (-0.2%). At the end of March 2013, the twelvemonth average rate of inflation was at -1.6 percent, down from 5.5 percent recorded at the end of March 2012.

On a yearly basis, consumer prices dropped by 3.5 percent in March 2013. Major price decreases were recorded in the following sectors:

1. <u>Housing</u>; Average prices in the Housing sector declined by 10.5 percent compared to March 2012, mainly as a result of decreases in the prices of Electricity, gas & other fuels (-15.3%), Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (-27.0%) and Maintenance & repair of dwellings (-0.6%).

2. <u>Clothing & footwear</u>; In March 2013, prices of Clothing & footwear fell with 8.6 percent compared to March 2012, mainly as a result of decreases in the average prices of Clothing (-9.4%) and Footwear (-1.6%).

3. <u>Household operation</u>; Average prices in the Household operation sector dropped by 3.7 percent in March 2013. Lower prices were recorded for Furniture, furnishings, carpets & other floor coverings (-11.1%), Household textiles (-13.9%), Household appliances (-6.8%) and Glassware, tableware & household utensils (-12.8%).



#### Key points

During the month of March 2013, the average WTI crude oil price fell with \$2.37 per barrel compared to the previous month, reaching \$92.94 per barrel. The Brent (Europe) crude oil reached \$108.47 per barrel in March 2013, down from \$116.05 per barrel recorded in February 2013.

In May 2013, the Brent crude oil spot price increased to an average of \$103 per barrel. The EIA expects that the Brent crude oil spot price will average \$105 per barrel in 2013 and \$100 per barrel in 2014. In 2012, the Brent crude oil spot price was at \$112 per barrel. Keep in mind that energy price forecasts are highly uncertain.

The EIA expects that regular gasoline retail prices, will average \$3.53 per gallon during the April-to-September period of 2013. The annual average gasoline retail price is projected to decrease from \$3.63 per gallon in 2012 to \$3.49 per gallon in 2013 and to \$3.37 per gallon in 2014.

U.S. diesel fuel retail prices are expected to average \$3.83 per gallon in the April-to-September period of 2013, down from an average of \$3.95 per gallon recorded in the similar period of 2012.





#### **Key points**

In March 2013, the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.14 per liter compared to the previous month, reaching Afl. 2.42 per liter. The average price of diesel rose by Afl. 0.08 per liter, reaching Afl. 2.19 per liter in March 2013. In March 2013, the average prices per household of water and electricity remained unchanged when compared to the previous month.



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

#### Key points

In March 2013, the average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) increased by 6.0 percent compared to March 2012. With the exception of Government (-3.2%), water usage increases were recorded for all sectors, particularly, Houses (+9.0%), Companies (+4.8%) and Hotels (+1.1%).

In the January-to-March period of 2013, the average water distribution is running 8.0 percent below the level recorded during the similar period of 2012.





#### Key points

In March 2013, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution rose by 10.4 percent compared to March 2012, in contrast to a drop of 6.4 percent recorded during the similar period of the previous year.

The electricity consumption, as reported by the Elmar, increased by 18.8 percent in March 2013, when compared to March 2012. During the first quarter of 2013, the total electricity usage rose by 2.2 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.



#### Key points

In March 2013, the total import of merchandise to Aruba rose by 2.3 percent compared to March 2012, in contrast to a drop of 26.6 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. With the exception of Mineral, chemical & related products (-12.1%) and Metal products, machinery & equipment (-12.8%), import increases have been recoded for Agriculture products (+16.6%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+11.0%) and Other transportable goods (+17.0%).

During the first three months of 2013, the total import of goods to Aruba increased by 3.9 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

The total exports of goods from Aruba declined by 15.0 percent in March 2013, when compared to March 2012. With the exception of Other transportable goods (+10.6%), export increases have been recorded for all commodities, particularly, Agriculture products (-8.4%), Mineral, chemical & related products (-80.5%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-38.6%) and Metal products, machinery & equipment (-37.9%).

In the January-to-March period of 2013, the total export of goods to Aruba expanded by 7.2 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.





#### Key points

In March 2013, the total government tax revenue rose by 6.7 percent compared to March 2012, in contrast to a decline of 4.4 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. In the January-to-March period of 2013, the total government tax revenue increased by 9.6 percent compared to the previous year, mainly as a result of increases in the Profit tax (+41.6%), Income tax (+168.5%), Other & non-tax revenues (+58.6%), Import duties (+7.1%) and Land tax (+28.9%).



#### Key points

In March 2013, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba rose by 11.4 percent compared to March 2012, following a 4.9 percent growth recorded during the similar period one year earlier. The main increases were recorded for the visitors from Venezuela (+55.9%), USA (+6.7%), Argentina (+62.9%), Colombia (+30.6%), Suriname (+116.9% and Sweden (+36.4%).

#### Year to date

In the January-to-March period of 2013, the total number of visitors to Aruba increased by 6.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2012. During the first three months of 2013, the number of cruise passengers increased by 6.5 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

The share of the US market, which is the largest market, fell from 64.3 percent in March 2012 to 61.5 percent in March 2013. The Venezuelan market, the second largest market, recorded a market share of 13.4 percent in March 2013, up from 10.1 percent recorded in March 2012.
