- The Literacy rate of Aruba is relatively high compared to the literacy rate in other regions of the world

- Worldwide, the literacy rate is in the disadvantage of women

The higher the level of education attained, the smaller the proportion of persons with an income of employment equal to or less than minimum wage










## **Literacy and Age**

63.8% of illiterate adults in the world is female 61.3% of illiterate youth in the world is female
