

Press Release Consumer Price Index April 2016

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 April 2016

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of April 2016.

The CPI for April 2016 is 116.54, a slight increase of 0.02% compared to the index of March 2016 (116.51) and accumulating a decrease of 1.6% up to and including April of this year. The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (April 2015 to April 2016) is -1.6%, a decrease of 2.7 percentage points (ppt) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (1.1%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period April 2015 - April 2016 is -0.2%, a decrease of 1.1 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period April 2014 - April 2015 (0.9%).

During this month, six of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (1.7%) and "Housing" (0.1%) sectors, causing an effect of 0.29 and 0.02 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.03 ppts on the CPI of April 2016.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by decreases in the indices for the "Recreation and culture" (-2.9%), "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (-0.3%) and "Household operation" (-0.5%) sectors, which had an influence of respectively, -0.24, -0.04 and -0.03 ppts on the CPI of April 2016. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of April 2016.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was caused by an increase of 5.3% in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment", which contributed to an effect of 0.41 ppts. The increase in the "Housing" sector was due to an increase in the category "Actual rentals for housing" (0.1%), which contributed to an effect of 0.02 ppts.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to a decrease of 25.5% in the category "Holidays", which contributed to an effect of -0.20 ppts. The decrease in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was caused by decreases of 1.2% and 0.1% in the categories "Non-alcoholic beverages" and "Food", which contributed to an effect of -0.02 and -0.01 ppts, respectively. The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Household textiles" (-2.8%), which contributed to an effect of -0.02 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to March 2016, 27.0% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.64 ppts, while 31.4% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.62 ppts and the remaining 41.5% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.5% and caused an influence of 0.32 ppts. The prices of services show a decrease of 0.8% and had an influence of -0.30 ppts on the CPI of April 2016.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 1.0% in April 2016, which is 0.3 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.7%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – is -4.6%, which is 4.5 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.1%). The food index shows an increase of 0.1%, which is 3.5 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (3.6%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years) in April 2016 is Afl. 4,320, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,057.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in April 2016

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In April 2016 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 40.19) had an increase of US\$ 2.72 (7.3%) compared to March 2016 (US\$ 37.47).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in April 2016, it stayed at Afl. 21.90 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity between 501 -1000 kWh did not change in April 2016, it stayed at Afl. 27.80 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to March 2016. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 308.76, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In April 2016 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 13.60 cents (9.2%) causing an effect of 0.40 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 7.10 cents (6.1%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of April 2016.

In April 2016, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 2.3% compared to March 2016, and had an influence of 0.41 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease of 0.5% in price, causing an effect of -0.39 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in April 2016

The "Food & catering services" index shows a decrease of 0.2% in April 2016, after a decrease of 1.0% in March 2016. The index for "Food at home" shows a decrease of 0.3% in April, as six of the eleven "Food at home" indices decreased in April 2016. The "Fruit" index registered the largest decrease (-1.4%) in April 2016. Furthermore, decreases of 1.2% and 0.7% were posted in the indices for "Non-alcoholic beverages" and "Vegetables", respectively. The "Fish and other seafood" index registered the largest increase (2.5%). Furthermore, increases of 1.2% and 0.6% were posted in the indices for "Potatoes and other tubers" and "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery".

Over the last 12 months the "Food & catering services" index has decreased by 0.9%. The "Food at home" index shows a decrease of 1.4%. The "Milk, cheese and eggs" index decreased by 8.3%, the largest decrease among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Food products n.e.c." index shows the largest increase (6.6%).

The index for "Food away from home" was unchanged in April 2016, after a decrease of 0.1% in March 2016 and has increased by 0.8% over the last 12 months.

In April 2016, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show a decrease in price of 0.2% compared to March 2016, and had an influence of -0.03 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.1%, causing an effect of 0.05 ppts on the CPI.
