

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 November 2018

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of November 2018.

The CPI for November 2018 is 122.62, an increase of 0.5% compared to the index of October 2018 (122.02) and accumulating an increase of 4.2% up to and including November of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (November 2017 to November 2018) is 5.1%, an increase of 6.0 ppts compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.9%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period November 2017 - November 2018 is 3.2%, an increase of 3.7 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period November 2016 - November 2017 (-0.5%).

During this month, seven (7) of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (1.3%) and the "Clothing and footwear" (3.8%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of 0.19 and 0.18 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.13 ppts on the CPI of November 2018.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by decreases in the indices for the "Health" (-0.5%) and "Restaurants and hotels" (-0.2%) sectors, each causing an effect of -0.01 ppt. The decrease in the remaining sector had an insignificant effect on the CPI of November 2018.

The increase in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Food" (1.4%), which contributed to an effect of 0.18 ppts. The increase in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was caused by an increase of 4.3% in the category "Clothing", which contributed to an effect of 0.19 ppts.

The decrease in the "Health" sector was mainly due to a decrease of 0.7% in the category "Medical products, appliances and equipment", which contributed to an effect of -0.01 ppt. The decrease in the "Restaurants and hotels" sector was mainly caused by a decrease in the category "Catering services" (-0.2%), which contributed to an effect of -0.01 ppt.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to October 2018, 41.8% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.72 ppts, while 25.9% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.24 ppts and the remaining 32.3% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.6% and caused an influence of 0.39 ppts. The prices of services showed an increase of 0.3% and had an influence of 0.10 ppts on the CPI of November 2018.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food — was 2.3% in November 2018, which is 2.0 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.3%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel — was 3.9%, which is 8.2 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-4.3%). The food index showed an increase of 6.9%, which is 6.0 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.9%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in November 2018 is Afl. 4,574, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,178.



Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in November 2018

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In November 2018 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 57.91) had a decrease of US\$ 13.53 (-18.9%) compared to October 2018 (US\$ 71.44).

The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in November 2018, it stayed at Afl. 34.52 cents per kWh. The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in November 2018, it stayed at Afl. 35.72 cents per kWh. Additionally, the total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity above 1000 kWh did not change in November 2018, it stayed at Afl. 45.93 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to October 2018. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 265.65, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In November 2018 the price of gasoline decreased by Afl. 1.80 cents (-0.8%) causing an effect of -0.05 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 4.10 cents (2.2%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of November 2018.

In November 2018, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed a decrease in price of 0.2% compared to October 2018, and had an influence of -0.04 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase of 0.6% in price, causing an effect of 0.53 ppt on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in November 2018

The "Food & catering services" index showed an increase of 1.0% in November 2018, after an increase of 0.4% in October 2018. The index for "Food at home" showed an increase of 1.3% in November, as six (6) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices increased in November 2018. The "Fruit" index registered the largest increase (5.6%) in November 2018. Furthermore, increases were posted in the indices for "Fish and other seafood" (3.2%) and "Vegetables" (3.1%). Furthermore, decreases of 1.2% and 0.6% were posted in the indices for "Potatoes and other tubers" and "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery".

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 8.3%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 9.7%. The "Fruit" index increased by 25.2%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" decreased by 0.2% in November 2018 and has increased by 3.7% over the last twelve (12) months.

In November 2018, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed an increase in price of 1.0% compared to October 2018, and had an influence of 0.18 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.4%, causing an effect of 0.30 ppts on the CPI.
