Consumer Price Index, base period June 2019

September 2019

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of September 2019.

Consumer Price Index for the month of September 2019

The CPI for September 2019 is 100.00, an increase of 0.2% compared to the index of August 2019 (99.80) and accumulating an increase of 3.4% up to and including September of this year. The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (September 2018 to September 2019) is 4.4, a decrease of 0.3 ppts compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (4.7%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period September 2018 - September 2019 is 4.1%, an increase of 1.8 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period September 2017 - September 2018 (2.3%).

During this month, seven (7) of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Household operation" (3.0%), "Recreation and culture" (1.5%) and "Clothing and footwear" (5.5%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of 0.21, 0.13 and 0.12 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.03 ppts on the CPI of September 2019.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by a decrease in the index for the "Transport" (-1.8%) sector, causing an effect of -0.23 ppts. This decrease was due to a decrease in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (-3.1%), which contributed to an effect of -0.26 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.05 ppts on the CPI of September 2019.

The increase in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Household appliances" (18.0%), which contributed to an effect of 0.21 ppts. The increase in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly caused by an increase of 5.4% in the category "Holidays", which contributed to an effect of 0.09 ppts. The increase in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Clothing" (6.4%), which contributed to an effect of 0.11 ppts.

Consumption basket

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 408 goods and services. Compared to August 2019, 36.3% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.97 ppts, while 27.0% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.77 ppts and the remaining 36.8% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.1% and caused an influence of 0.05 ppts. The prices of services showed an increase of 0.4% and had an influence of 0.15 ppts on the CPI of September 2019.

Core inflation

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 2.9% in September 2019. The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was 0.8%. The food index showed an increase of 12.7%.

Subsistence level

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in September 2019 is Afl. 4,992, an increase of Afl. 355 compared to September 2018 (Afl. 4,637). The subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl. 2,377, an increase of Afl. 169 compared to September 2018 (Afl. 2,208).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in September 2019

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In September 2019 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 57.03) had an increase of US\$ 1.86 (3.4%) compared to August 2019 (US\$ 55.17).

The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in September 2019, it stayed at Afl. 34.52 cents per kWh. The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in September 2019, it stayed at Afl. 35.72 cents per kWh. Additionally, the total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity above 1000 kWh did not change in September 2019, it stayed at Afl. 45.93 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to August 2019. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 265.65, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In September 2019 the price of gasoline registered a decrease of Afl. 10.60 cents (-4.9%) and had an effect of -0.23 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 4.40 cents (-2.5%) and had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of September 2019.

In September 2019, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed a decrease in price of 1.5% compared to August 2019, and had an influence of -0.24 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 404 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase of 0.5% in price, causing an effect of 0.44 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in September 2019

The "Food & catering services" index showed a decrease of 0.2% in September 2019, after a decrease of 0.4% in August 2019. The index for "Food at home" showed a decrease of 0.3% in September, as six (6) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices decreased in September 2019. The "Vegetables" index registered the largest decrease (-4.0%) in September 2019. Furthermore, decreases were posted in the indices for "Potatoes and other tubers" (-2.1%), "Fruit" (-0.8) and "Fish and other seafood" (-0.7%).

The "Bread and cereals" index registered the largest increase (1.9%) in September 2019. Other increases were registered for the indices of "Oils and fats" (1.0%), "Non-alcoholic beverages" (0.9%) and "Milk, cheese and eggs" (0.7%).

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 12.2%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 15.5%. The "Fruit" index increased by 43.9%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" was unchanged in September 2019 and has increased by 2.2% over the last twelve (12) months.

In September 2019, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed a decrease in price of 0.2% compared to August 2019, and had an influence of -0.05 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.3%, causing an effect of 0.25 ppts on the CPI.

The subsistence level in September 2019

The subsistence level is the minimum level of income which is perceived necessary to achieve an adequate standard of living in a given country. The subsistence level is usually determined by estimating the cost of all the essential resources that an average adult consumes in one month or year. This is commonly called a basic needs index, and varies according to the price of food, clothing, housing, transport and other items in the "basket". Equivalent scales are used to adjust the assumed standard of living, of households of different sizes and composition. The scale assigns a weight of 1.0 for the first adult and 0.5 for each additional adult in the household (aged 15+) and a weight of 0.3 for each child (aged 0-14 years). The subsistence level is based on figures of the report "Bestaansminimum 2010" published by the CBS in December 2010 and is monthly updated for inflation using the monthly CPI. The reference unit used in this report is a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years).

In September 2019 the monthly subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) (Afl. 4,992) showed an increase of Afl. 355 compared to September 2018 (Afl. 4,637) and was mainly caused by an increase of Afl. 291 in the sector "Food and non-alcoholic beverages".

In September 2019, the monthly subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl 2,377, which represents an income deficit of Afl. 615, an increase of Afl. 118 compared to the deficit observed one year ago (Afl. 497). This deficit is the highest registered over a period of five (5) years for the month September.
