

Consumer Price Index, base period June 2019 October 2019

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of October 2019.

Consumer Price Index for the month of October 2019

The CPI for October 2019 is 100.49, an increase of 0.5% compared to the index of September 2019 (100.00) and accumulating an increase of 3.9% up to and including October of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (October 2018 to October 2019) is 5.0, an increase of 1.1 ppts compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (3.9%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period October 2018 - October 2019 is 4.2%, an increase of 1.5 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period October 2017 - October 2018 (2.7%).

During this month, five (5) of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Recreation and culture" (4.4%) and "Transport" (0.9%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of 0.37 and 0.11 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.21 ppts on the CPI of October 2019.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by a decrease in the index for the "Household operation" (-1.2%) sector, causing an effect of -0.09 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.11 ppts on the CPI of October 2019.

The increase in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Holidays" (21.0%), which contributed to an effect of 0.37 ppts. The increase in the "Transport" sector was mainly caused by an increase of 19.2% in the category "Transport services", which contributed to an effect of 0.09 ppts.

The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Furniture, furnishings, carpets and other floor coverings" (-9.2%), which contributed to an effect of -0.05 ppts.

Consumption basket


The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 408 goods and services. Compared to September 2019, 42.6% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 1.35 ppts, while 33.8% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.86 ppts and the remaining 23.5% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.04% and caused an influence of 0.02 ppts. The prices of services showed an increase of 1.2% and had an influence of 0.46 ppts on the CPI of October 2019.

Core inflation

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 3.1% in October 2019. The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was 0.3%. The food index showed an increase of 13.1%.

Subsistence level

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in October 2019 is Afl. 5,002, an increase of Afl. 358 compared to October 2018 (Afl. 4,644). The subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl. 2,382, an increase of Afl. 171 compared to October 2018 (Afl. 2,211).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in October 2019

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In October 2019 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 53.77) had a decrease of US\$ 3.26 (-5.7%) compared to September 2019 (US\$ 57.03).

The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in October 2019, it stayed at Afl. 34.52 cents per kWh. The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in October 2019, it stayed at Afl. 35.72 cents per kWh. Additionally, the total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity above 1000 kWh did not change in October 2019, it stayed at Afl. 45.93 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to September 2019. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 265.65, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In October 2019 the price of gasoline registered an increase of Afl. 0.60 cents (0.3%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 5.60 cents (3.2%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of October 2019.

In October 2019, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed an increase in price of 0.2% compared to September 2019, and had an influence of 0.02 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 404 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase of 0.6% in price, causing an effect of 0.46 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in October 2019

The "Food & catering services" index showed a decrease of 0.3% in October 2019, after a decrease of 0.2% in September 2019. The index for "Food at home" showed a decrease of 0.4% in October, as four (4) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices decreased in October 2019. The "Vegetables" index registered the largest decrease (-3.4%) in October 2019. Furthermore, decreases were posted in the indices for "Fruit" (-1.1%), "Oils and fats" (-0.8) and "Meat" (-0.2%).

The "Potatoes and other tubers" (1.7%) and "Fish and other seafood" (1.7%) indices registered the largest increases in October 2019. Other increases were registered for the indices of "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery" (0.8%), "Nonalcoholic beverages" (0.7%) and "Food products n.e.c." (0.5%).

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 11.6%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 14.6%. The "Fruit" index increased by 42.6%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" registered an increase of 0.3% in October 2019 and has increased by 2.6% over the last twelve (12) months.

In October 2019, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed a decrease in price of 0.3% compared to September 2019, and had an influence of -0.06 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.7%, causing an effect of 0.55 ppts on the CPI.
