

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 June 2012

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of June 2012.

The CPI for June 2012 is 121.20, a decrease of 0.50% compared to the index of May 2012 (121.81) and accumulating a decrease of 0.13% up to and including June of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (June 2011 to June 2012) is 0.95, a decrease of 3.91 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (4.86).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period June 2011 - June 2012 is 4.81, an increase of 3.73 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period June 2010 - June 2011 (1.08).

During this month, six of the twelve sectors registered decreases in prices. The decrease which had the greatest influence on the CPI was registered for the "Transport" sector (-2.77%), causing an effect of -0.50 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of -0.08 ppts on the CPI of June 2012.

Aforementioned decreases were partially offset mainly by increases in the indices for the "Recreation and culture" (0.58%) and "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (0.12%) sectors, which together had an influence of 0.07 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of June 2012.

The decrease in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (-4.97%), which contributed to an effect of -0.50 ppts.

The increase in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly caused by an increase of 9.11% in the category "Holidays", which contributed to an effect of 0.06 ppts. The increase in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was caused by increases of 0.34% and 0.08% in the categories "Non-alcoholic beverages" and "Food", which together contributed to an effect of 0.02 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to May 2012, 36.5% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.36 ppts, while 31.9% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.86 ppts and the remaining 31.6% had no change in price. The prices of goods decreased by 0.83% and caused an influence of -0.54 ppts. The prices of services show an increase of 0.13% and had an influence of 0.04 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in June 2012 an increase of 1.77%, which is 1.89 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.12%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered an increase of 14.35%, which is 8.80 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (5.55%). The food index shows an increase of 5.34%, which is 4.94 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.40%).



Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in June 2012

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In June 2012 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 83.22) had a decrease of US\$ 12.89 (-13.41%) compared to May 2012 (US\$ 96.11).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh surcharge did not change in June 2012, it stayed at Afl. 32.49 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity above 500 kWh surcharge did not change either in June 2012, it stayed at Afl. 38.47 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to May 2012. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 363.27, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 195.47.

In June 2012 the price of gasoline decreased by Afl. 0.17 (-6.78%) causing an effect of -0.48 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 0.13 (-5.84%) and had an effect of -0.02 ppts on the CPI of June 2012.

In June 2012, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show a decrease in price of 2.12% compared to May 2012, and had an influence of -0.50 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.01%, causing an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in June 2012

The "Food & catering services" index is composed of the indices for the "Food & Non-alcoholic beverages" sector (hereafter: "Food at home") and the "Catering services" (hereafter: "Food away from home") category. The "Food & catering services" index increased with 0.05% in June 2012 after decreasing by 0.07% in May 2012. The index for "Food at home" shows an increase of 0.12% after declining three months in a row. Eight of the thirteen "Food at home" indices increased in June 2012. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest increase (3.22%) in June, mainly caused by an increase in the index for "Potatoes" of 4.14%. The "Vegetables" index shows an increase of 1.74%, the third consecutive monthly increase, which was mainly caused by increases in the indices of "Onions" (3.86%) and "Celery and broccoli" (5.03%). The "Meat" index decreased the most (0.49%), followed by decreases of 0.47% and 0.46% in the indices for "Coffee, tea and cocoa" and "Oils and fats", respectively.

Over the last 12 months the "Food & catering services" index has increased by 3.49%. The "Food at home" index shows an increase of 2.87%. The "Oils and fats" index increased by 9.17%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Potatoes and other tubers" index decreased by 12.12%, followed by a decrease of 0.90% in the index for "Vegetables"; the only two declines among the groups over that period.

The index for "Food away from home" decreased by 0.21% in June 2012, after a series of ten consecutive monthly increases, and has increased by 5.70% over the last 12 months.

In June 2012, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show an increase in price of 0.05% compared to May 2012, and had an influence of 0.01 ppt on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.61%, causing an effect of -0.51 ppts on the CPI.
