Population change by age, Census 2000-2008



Since the last Census held in 2000, the population of Aruba increased with 15,544 persons. And even though the population is not growing as fast as it used to be, the net growth in 2008 totaled 14.5 persons per thousand.

With an estimated 106,050 persons by the end of 2008, the population density is at 589.2 persons per square kilometer. Ranking number 14 on the most populated countries of the world.

It is the first time since 1995 that the male immigrants outnumber the female immigrants. The sex ratio in 2008 at the registry is 121 men for every 100 women.

Locals returning to the island are about one third of all persons migrating to Aruba. In 2008 however, only 26 percent of the migrants coming to Aruba were born in Aruba.

On the other hand the majority of persons leaving the island were born in Aruba. Since 2004 the emigration rate was less than 20 per thousand, reaching even only 15 per thousand in 2005. The numbers however are slightly increasing again.

The average age of the population increased from being 33 years in 1991 to 37 years in 2008. This is in part explained by the diminishing group of young people (ages 0-14 yrs.). The percentage of the population aged 0-14 years fell from 24.4 percent in 1991 to 19.9 percent in 2008.



Among this group, the most important decrease is that of children aged 0-4 years, where the percentage decreased over the same period from 7.7 percent to 6 percent. The proportion of the elderly is increasing and the youngest population is decreasing.

The number of elderly is slowly but surely increasing. Persons aged 65 years or older have a share of 9 percent of the total population in 2008. In absolute figures the number of persons 65 years and older increased from 6,729 persons in 2000 to 9,960 in 2008; a growth rate of 48 per thousand. Their growth rate was 44 per thousand from 1991 to 2000.

Of the population aged 65 years and over, females prevail. The population sex ratio at this level is 73 males per 100 females. While the overall sex ratio is at 91.8 male per 100 females.
