

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006

June 2009

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of June 2009.

Overview Consumer Price Indices

- The CPI for June 2009 is 112.51, an increase of 2.42% compared to the index of May 2009 (109.86).
- The percentage change for the first 6 months (January to June 2009) of the CPI is 4.30, 1.24 percentage points (ppts) lower compared to 5.54 for the same period of last year.
- The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (June 2008 to June 2009) is -3.02, a decrease of 12.32 (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (9.30).
- The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period June 2008 - June 2009 is 2.42, a decrease of 5.81 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period June 2007 - June 2008 (8.23).

Monthly Percentage Change

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to May 2009, 31.9% of these products had an increase in price, while 21.9% showed a decrease and the remaining 46.2% had no change in price.

The prices of all products (goods and services) in the consumption basket of the CPI show an increase of 2.42% for the month of June 2009 compared to the prices observed in May 2009.

The prices of goods increased by 3.39% and caused an influence of 2.20 ppts on the percentage change of the CPI. The prices of services show also an increase (0.62%) and had an influence of 0.22 ppts on the CPI.

In June 2009, the sectors that had the greatest influence on the percentage change of the CPI are:

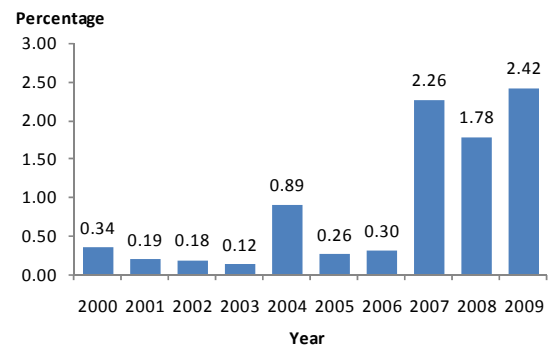
- Housing (1.77), where increases in prices were mainly registered in the categories "Electricity, gas and other fuels", "Water supply and miscellaneous services relating to the dwelling" and "Actual rentals for housing".
- Transport (0.55), where increases in prices were registered in the categories "Operation of personal transport equipment" and "Transport services".
- Recreation and culture (0.17), where increases in prices were registered in the categories "Holidays" and "Other recreational items and equipment; gardens and pets".
- Food and non-alcoholic beverages (-0.07), where a decrease in prices was registered in the category "Food".

Graph 1 shows that the monthly percentage change of the CPI increased by 0.64 ppts to 2.42 in June of 2009 from 1.78 in June of 2008.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities and gasoline in June 2009

The prices of utilities (electricity and water supply), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In June 2009 the average price of crude oil increased by US\$ 12.79 (+23.3%) per barrel compared to May.

Fuel surcharge shows in June an increase of Afl. 4.87 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water show also increases in price compared to May 2009. The average electricity price increased to Afl. 267.15 (+15.2%), while the price of water increased to Afl. 141.19 (+14.9%).

The price of gasoline shows for the fifth month in a row an increase in price. In June 2009 it increased by Afl. 0.16 (+9.68%) causing an effect of 0.50 pts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered also an increase in June 2009. Compared to May 2009 it increased by Afl. 0.05 (+3.78%) causing an effect of 0.01 pts on the CPI.

In June 2009, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in prices of 13.29% compared to May 2009, and had an influence of 2.21 pts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in prices of 0.24%, causing an effect of 0.20 pts on the CPI.
