

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 January 2012

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of January 2012.

The CPI for January 2012 is 121.01, a decrease of 0.29% compared of December 2011 (121.36).

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (January 2011 to January 2012) is 5.42, an increase of 4.96 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.46).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period January 2011 - January 2012 is 4.79, an increase of 3.19 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period January 2010 - January 2011 (1.60).

During this month, six of the twelve sectors registered decreases in prices. The decreases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Recreation and culture" (-3.22%) and "Household operation" (-0.41%) sectors, causing an effect of respectively -0.27 and -0.03 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of -0.04 ppts on the CPI of January 2012.


Aforementioned decreases were partially offset by an increase mainly in the index for the "Communications" sector (0.49%), which had an influence of 0.02 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.03 ppts on the CPI of January 2012.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to decreases in the categories "Holidays" (-27.18%) and "Audio-visual, photographic and information processing equipment" (-6.36%), which contributed to an effect of -0.21 and -0.07 ppts respectively. The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly the result from a decrease in the category "Furniture, furnishings, carpets and other floor coverings" (-6.12%), which contributed to an effect of -0.06 ppts.

The increase in the "Communications" sector was mainly caused by an increase of 0.55% in the category "Telephone and telefax services", which contributed to an effect of 0.03 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to December 2011, 40.5% of these products had an increase in price, while 33.2% showed a decrease and the remaining 26.3% had no change in price. The prices of goods decreased by 0.29% and caused an influence of -0.19 ppts. The prices of services show a decrease of 0.29% and had an influence of -0.10 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in January 2012 an increase of 1.97%, which is 2.58 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.61%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered an increase of 14.11%, which is 1.68 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (12.43%). The food index shows an increase of 4.91%, which is 7.22 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-2.31%).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in January 2012

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In January 2012 the average price per barrel (US\$ 100.53) for the West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) had an increase of US\$ 1.81 (1.83%) compared to December 2011 (US\$ 98.72).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh surcharge did not change in January 2012, it stayed at Afl. 32.49 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity above 500 kWh surcharge did not change either in January 2012, it stayed at Afl. 38.47 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to December 2011. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 363.27, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 195.47.

In January 2012 the price of gasoline registered an increase of 0.14% and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of January 2012. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 0.08 (4.00%) and had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of January 2012.

In January 2012, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show a decrease in price of 0.02% compared to December 2011, and had no influence on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.36%, causing an effect of -0.28 ppts on the CPI.
