Highlights August 2011 in Review

Consumer Prices:

- Year over year inflation up by 6.8 percent
- Period average inflation at 2.1 percent in August 2011

Key points

At the end of August 2011, the twelve-month average rate of inflation was at 2.1 percent, down from 2.3 percent recorded at the end of August 2010. On a monthly basis, the total consumer price index increased by 1.6 percent in August 2011, particularly as a result of increases of Housing (+3.9%), Education Restaurants & hotels (+1.6%). (+1.6%). Transport (+1.4%), Recreation & culture (+0.8%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.5%). Household operation (+0.3%).Communications (+0.2%).

On a yearly basis, consumer prices increased by 6.8 percent in August 2011. Major price increases were recorded in the following sectors:

- 1. *Housing*; Average prices in the Housing sector rose by 10.3 percent compared to August 2010. Major price increases were recorded for Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (+18.3%), Electricity, gas & other fuels (+13.7%), Actual rentals for housing (+5.6%) and Maintenance & repair of dwellings (+2.1%).
- 2. *Transport*; In August 2011, prices in the Transport sector increased by 12.4 percent compared to August 2010. Higher prices were recorded for Transport services (+20.5%), Operation of personal transport equipment (+19.1%) and Purchase of vehicles (+2.9%).
- 3. Food & non-alcoholic beverages; Prices in this sector increased by 5.1 percent in August 2011. Average prices of Food and Alcoholic beverages increased by 5.4 and 3.3 percent respectively, when compared to August 2010.



Key points

The EIA expects the US average refiner acquisition cost of crude oil to remain relatively flat, averaging about \$100 per barrel in 2011 and 2012.

The West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil spot prices fell from an average of \$110 per barrel in April to \$86 per barrel in August, and remained near this level through October 2011

The EIA forecasts that the annual average regular-grade gasoline retail prices, which averaged \$2.78 per gallon in 2010, will increase to an average of \$3.54 per gallon in 2011, before declining to an average \$3.46 per gallon in 2012. The higher retail prices in 2011 reflects not only the higher cost of crude oil but also changes in average U.S. refinery gasoline margin (the difference between refinery wholesale gasoline prices and the average cost of crude oil). The average U.S. refinery margin increases from \$0.34 per gallon in 2010, to \$0.48 per gallon in 2011, then declines to \$0.42 per gallon in 2012.

On high-way diesel fuel retail prices, which average \$2.99 per gallon in 2010, will average \$3.84 per gallon in 2011 and \$3.79 per gallon in 2012.





Key points

Since April 2011, the average price of water and electricity remained unchanged at Afl. 349.78. In August 2011, however, the average price of water and electricity increased by 3.9 and 13.3 percent respectively, compared to July 2011. The price of gasoline rose with Afl. 0.08 in August 2011, reaching Afl. 2.43 per liter. The price of diesel increased by Afl. 0.04 compared to the previous month, reaching an average price of Afl. 2.11 per liter. Average world crude oil prices in August 2011 reached \$ 107.39, down from \$ 110.74 recorded in July 2011.





Key points

Average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) declined by 9.8 percent in August 2011, when compared to August 2010. With the exception of Government (+17.1%), water usage decreases were recorded by Households (-9.2%), Hotels (-13.2%) and Companies (-9.6%). In the January-to-August period of 2011, total water distribution is running 7.1 percent below the level recorded in the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In August 2011, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution fell with 2.7 percent compared to August 2010, in contrast to an increase of 3.6 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. In the January-to-August period of 2011, electricity distribution declined by 4.3 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

On a monthly basis, the total electricity usage (as reported by the ELMAR N.V.) increased by 3.7 percent in August 2011. The main usage increases were recorded in the Commercial sector (+8.8%), Large users (+2.7%) and Households (+2.4%).







Key points

Total import of merchandise expanded by 23.2 percent in August 2011, when compared to August 2010. Import increases were recorded for all commodity groups, particularly, Metal products, machinery & equipment (+35.3%), Agriculture products (+23.6%), Other transportable goods (+19.8%), Mineral, chemical & related products (+9.7%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+16.3%). In the January-to-August period of 2011, total imports increased by 25.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

In August 2011, the total exports increased by 26.7 percent compared to August 2010, in contrast to a drop of 28.9 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. With the exception of Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-34.9%), increases has been recorded for Agriculture products (+20.8%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (+101.0%), Other transportable goods (+62.2%) and Mineral, chemical & related products (+143.1%). On a year to date basis, total exports in August expanded by 28.9 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In August 2011, the total government tax revenue increased by 5.2 percent compared to August 2010, up from a drop of 9.3 percent recorded in the same period one year earlier. The most notable increases were recorded for Import duties (+21.3%), Long-lease property rights (+131.0%), Profit tax (+25.9%), Turnover tax (+16.5%), Dividend tax (+426.4%), Excises on beer (+54.5%), Land tax (+43.9%) and Tourist tax (+21.8%). The Transfer tax and the Wage tax, on the other hand, fell with 86.5 and 10.6 percent respectively, compared to August 2010. In the January-to-August period of 2011, total tax revenues is running 26.0 percent below the level recorded in the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In August 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors increased by 9.1 percent compared to August 2010, in contrast to a drop of 2.9 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. The most notable increases were recorded for visitors from Venezuela (+32.6%), Italy (+165.4%), Argentina (+102.3%), the United Kingdom (+23.1%) and the Netherlands Antilles (+23.6%).

In addition, stay-over visitors from the Netherlands and Brazil increased by 3.5 and 5.3 percent respectively, compared to August 2010.

On the other hand, visitors from the United States declined by 0.4 percent in August 2011, compared to August 2010.

In the January-to-August period of 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba increased by 6.6 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

During the first eight months of 2011, the market share of US visitors dropped from 67.7 percent in 2010, to 63.4 percent in 2011. The Venezuelan market is the second largest market, rose from 9.1 percent in August 2010, to 11.6 percent in August 2011.
