Key points

At the end of September 2011, the twelvemonth average rate of inflation was at 2.7 percent, up from 2.6 percent recorded at the end of September 2010. On a monthly basis, the total consumer price index declined by 0.3 percent in September 2011, particularly as a result of decreases in the average prices of Transport (-1.6%), Clothing & footwear (-0.8%), Household operation (-0.3%) and Housing (-0.3%). On the other hand, price increases has been recorded for Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+1.1%), Health (+0.3%), Education (+0.1%) and Recreation & culture (+0.1%).

On a yearly basis, consumer prices increased by 6.5 percent in September 2011. Major price increases were recorded in the following sectors:

- 1. *Housing*; Average prices in the Housing sector increased by 9.9 percent compared to September 2010. Major price increases were recorded for Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (+18.3%), Electricity, gas & other fuels (+13.7%) and Actual rentals for housing (+5.6%). Prices of Maintenance & repair of dwellings fell with 0.8 percent.
- 2. *Transport*; In September 2011, prices in the Transport sector increased by 10.7 percent compared to September 2010. Higher prices were recorded for Operation of personal transport equipment (+17.3%), Transport services (+14.6%) and Purchase of vehicles (+2.1%).
- 3. Food & non-alcoholic beverages; Prices in this sector rose with 6.3 percent in September 2011. Average prices of Food and Alcoholic beverages increased by 6.8 and 2.5 percent respectively, compared to September 2010.



Key points

Energy price forecasts are highly uncertain. The EIA expects the US average refiner acquisition cost of crude oil to increase slightly over the next year, averaging about \$101 per barrel in 2011 and \$102 per barrel in 2012.

The EIA expects that the annual average regular-grade gasoline retail prices, which was \$2.78 per gallon in 2010, will be \$3.53 per gallon in 2011 and \$3.45 per gallon in 2012. The higher retail prices in 2011 reflects not only the higher cost of crude oil but also changes in average U.S. refinery gasoline margin (the difference between refinery wholesale gasoline prices and the average cost of crude oil), which increases from \$0.34 per gallon in 2010, to \$0.47 per gallon in 2011, then declines to \$0.35 per gallon in 2012.

On high-way diesel fuel retail prices, which average \$2.99 per gallon in 2010, will average \$3.85 per gallon in both 2011 and 2012.





Key points

In September 2011, the average price of water and electricity remained unchanged compared to the previous month. The price of gasoline fell with Afl. 0.08 in September 2011, reaching Afl. 2.35 per liter. The price of diesel declined by by Afl. 0.06 compared to the previous month, reaching an average price of Afl. 2.05 per liter.

In September 2011, the average world crude oil spot prices (Brent, Europe) reached \$ 112.83, up from \$ 110.22 recorded in August 2011. The WTI-Cushing was at \$85.52 down from \$86.33 in the previous month.



Key points

Average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) fell with 6.4 percent in September 2011, when compared to September 2010. Water usage decreases has been recorded for all sectors, particularly, Households (-7.0%), Hotels (-5.8%), Companies (-5.7%) and Government (-2.1%). In the January-to-September period of 2011, total water distribution is running 7.0 percent below the level recorded in the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In September 2011, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution increased by 4.0 percent compared to September 2010, in contrast to a drop of 5.9 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. In the January-to-September period of 2011, electricity distribution declined by 3.4 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.



Key points

Total import of merchandise increased by 29.0 percent in September 2011, when compared to September 2010. With the exception of Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-2.5%), import increases has been recorded for Metal products, machinery & equipment (+67.2%), Other transportable goods (+32.6%), Agriculture products (+22.5%), and Mineral, chemical & related products (+4.6%). In the January-to-September period of 2011, total imports expanded by 26.0 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

In September 2011, the total exports increased by 142.2 percent compared to September 2010, in contrast to a drop of 43.0 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. Export increases has been recorded for all commodity groups, particularly, Agriculture products (+70.3%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+1,044.8%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (+518.6%), Other transportable goods (+294.0%) and Mineral, chemical & related products (+366.7%). On a year to date basis, total exports in September rose by 40.5 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In September 2011, the total government tax revenue rose by 0.4 percent compared to September 2010, up from a drop of 13.1 percent recorded in the same period one year earlier. The most notable revenue increases were recorded for Tourist tax (+48.5%), Long-lease property rights (+138.9%), Income tax (+81.5%), Import duties (+8.2%), Excises on spirits (+84.4%), Turnover tax (+10.8%) and Profit tax (+5.2%). On the other hand, the Wage tax, Land tax and the Excises on beer fell with 21.2. 40.1 and 56.8 percent respectively, compared to September 2010. In the January-to-September period of 2011, total tax revenues is running 23.9 percent below the level recorded in the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In September 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors increased by 9.6 percent compared to September 2010, following a 5.7 percent growth recorded in the similar period one year earlier. The Venezuelan market increased by 36.5 percent (+4,457 visitors) compared to September 2010. Other South American markets that experienced significant increases during September 2011 were the Argentinian market (+671 visitors), the Brazilian market (+333 visitors) and the Colombian market (+146 visitors).

Furthermore, the number of stay-over visitors from Canada rose by 27.4 percent in September 2011, while the visitors from the Netherlands declined by 5.2 percent.

The total number of visitors from the United States decreased by 3.0 percent in September 2011, when compared to September 2010.

In the January-to-September period of 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba rose by 6.8 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

On a year to date basis, the market share of US visitors declined from 66.5 percent in 2010, to 62.1 percent in September 2011. The Venezuelan market is the second largest market, recording a market share of 12.8 percent, up from 10.0 percent in 2010.
