Highlights October 2011 in Review

Consumer Prices:

- Year over year inflation up by 6.5 percent
- Period average inflation at 3.2 percent in October 2011
- Price of gasoline down by Afl. 0.08 in October 2011
- A slight drop in the price of diesel in October 2011

Key points

In October 2011, the total consumer price index fell with 0.5 percent compared to September 2011, particularly as a result of average prices decreases in the Communications (-4.6%), Transport (-1.2%), Recreation & culture (-1.0%), Household operation (-0.8%), Clothing & footwear (-0.3%), Alcoholic beverages & tobacco (-0.2%) and Misc. goods & services (-0.1%). On the other hand, price increases were recorded for Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.4%), Health (+0.1%), Restaurants & hotels (+0.1%), Education (+0.1%) and Housing (+0.1%). At the end of October 2011, the twelve-month average rate of inflation was at 3.2 percent, up from 2.9 percent recorded at the end of October 2010.

On a yearly basis, consumer prices increased by 6.5 percent in October 2011. Major price increases were recorded in the following sectors:

- 1. *Housing*; Average prices in the Housing sector rose by 11.9 percent compared to October 2010, particularly as a result of increases of Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (+23.9%), Electricity, gas & other fuels (+17.2%) and Actual rentals for housing (+5.6%). Prices of Maintenance & repair of dwellings fell with 1.6 percent.
- 2. *Transport*; In October 2011, prices in the Transport sector increased by 9.6 percent compared to October 2010. Higher prices were recorded for Operation of personal transport equipment (+15.1%), Transport services (+14.3%) and Purchase of vehicles (+2.1%).
- 3. Food & non-alcoholic beverages; Prices in this sector increased by 6.5 percent in October 2011. Average prices of Food and Alcoholic beverages increased by 7.0 and 3.5 percent respectively, compared to October 2010.



Key points

At the end of 2011, the EIA projects the final average WTI price for 2011 at \$95 per barrel. A monthly average high of \$109.53 per barrel for April 2011 followed the disruption in Libyan crude oil production, while a monthly low of \$85.52 in September 2011, as a result of a deteriorating expectation of world economic growth.

The EIA's current forecast for WTI crude oil spot price averages \$101 per barrel in the fourth quarter of 2012 rising to an average of \$106 per barrel in the fourth quarter of 2013. Keep in mind that energy price forecast are highly uncertain.

The EIA expects that the regular-grade gasoline retail prices to average \$3.48 per gallon in 2012, will be \$3.55 per gallon in 2013.

On high-way diesel fuel retail prices, which average \$3.84 per gallon in 2011, will average \$3.85 per gallon in 2012 and \$3.93 per gallon in 2013.

In October 2011, the average world crude oil spot prices (Brent, Europe) reached \$ 109.55, down from \$ 112.83 recorded in September 2011. The WTI-Cushing reached \$86.32 down from \$85.52 in the previous month.





Key points

In October 2011, the average price of water and electricity remained unchanged when compared to the previous month. The price of gasoline dropped with Afl. 0.08 in October 2011, reaching Afl. 2.27 per liter. The price of diesel fell slightly compared to the previous month, reaching an average price of Afl. 2.04 per liter.





Key points

In October 2011, average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) increased by 8.4 percent compared to October 2010. Water usage increases has been recorded for all sectors, particularly, Hotels (+16.7%), Households (+4.4%), Companies (+9.8%) and Government (+20.1%). In the January-to-October period of 2011, total water distribution is running 5.7 percent below the level recorded during the similar period of 2010.





Key points

In October 2011, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution declined by 1.3 percent compared to October 2010, following a decrease of 1.6 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. In the January-to-October period of 2011, electricity distribution declined by 3.2 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

On a monthly basis, the total electricity usage (as reported by the ELMAR N.V.) deceased by 1.3 percent in October 2011, mainly as a result of a drop in the usage in the commercial sector (-7.6%) and the Large users (-0.8%). Electricity usage by Households increased by 1.9 percent in October 2011, when compared to the previous month.



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

Key points

Total import of merchandise expanded by 32.3 percent in October 2011, when compared to October 2010. Import increases has been recorded for all commodities, particularly, Mineral, chemical & related products (+83.1%), Metal products, machinery & equipment (+46.7%), Agriculture products (+14.6%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+21.3%) and Other transportable goods (+8.5%). In the January-to-October period of 2011, total imports increased by 26.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

In October 2011, the total exports rose by 87.1 percent compared to October 2010, in contrast to a drop of 61.4 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. With the exception of Mineral, chemical & related products (-49.2%) and Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-24.3%), export increases has been recorded for Agriculture products (+18.8%), Other transportable goods (+1.324.4%) and Metal products, machinery & equipment (+25.6%). On a year to date basis, total exports in October increased by 44.0 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In October 2011, the total government tax revenue increased by 28.2 percent compared to October 2010, in contrast to a drop of 24.0 percent recorded in the same period one year earlier. The most notable revenue increases were recorded for the Profit tax (+177.9%), Land tax (+179.1%), Excises on beer (+172.0%), Wage tax (+8.9%), Import duties (+11.3%), Excises on cigarettes (+86.6%), Transfer tax (+311.1%), Long-lease property rights (+118.9%) and Turnover tax (+9.3%). In addition, the Tourist tax rose by 6.3 percent compared to October 2010. In the January-to-October period of 2011, total tax revenues declined by 20.6 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.



Key points

In October 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors declined by 2.6 percent compared to October 2010, in contrast to an increase of 5.9 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. The total number of visitors from the United States dropped by 8.2 percent (-3,470 visitors) in October 2011. The number of U.S. visitors has been dropping since August 2011. In addition, visitors from the U.K. fell with 24.1 percent (-435 visitors) compared to October 2010.

On the other hand, the total visitors from Venezuela, rose by 12.6 percent (+929 visitors) in October 2010. In addition, total visitors from Argentina, Canada, Italy and the Netherlands increased by 106.2, 17.8, 108.9 and 2.6 percent in October 2011.

In the January-to-October period of 2011, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba increased by 5.8 percent compared to the similar period of 2010.

On a year to date basis, the market share of US visitors fell from 66.1 percent in 2010, to 61.9 percent in October 2011. The Venezuelan market is the second largest market, recording a market share of 12.8 percent, up from 10.1 percent in 2010.
