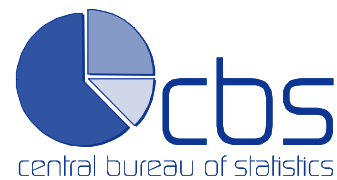

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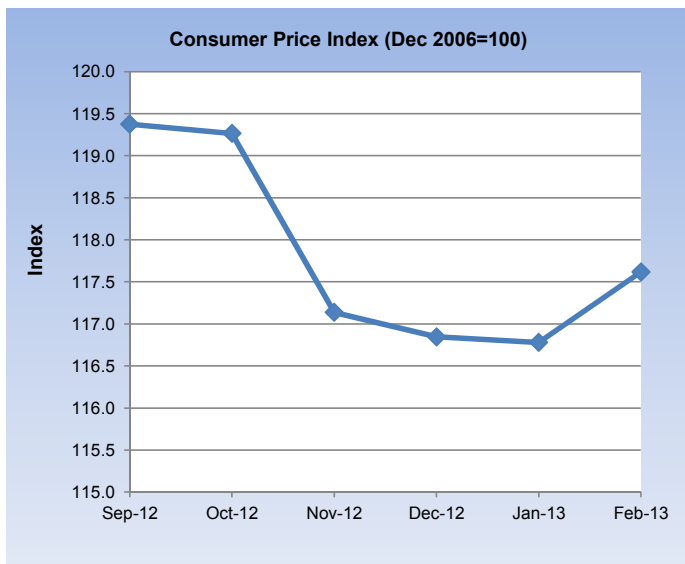

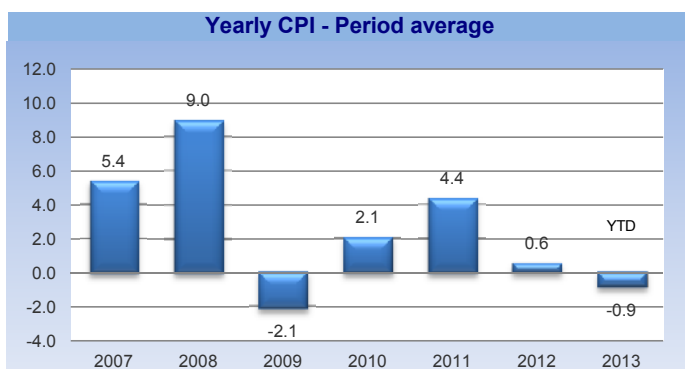

### Key points

In February 2013, the total consumer price index increased by 0.7 percent compared to the previous month. With the exception of Household operation (-0.1%), increases in average prices have been recorded for Transport (+2.6%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.7%), Clothing & footwear (+0.7%), Recreation & culture (+0.4%), Health (+0.3%), Communications (+0.2%), Restaurants & hotels (+0.2%), Housing (+0.2%) and Miscellaneous goods & services (+0.1%). At the end of February 2013, the twelve-month average rate of inflation was at -0.9 percent, down from 5.2 percent recorded at the end of February 2012.

On a yearly basis, consumer prices fell with 3.2 percent in February 2013. Major price decreases were recorded in the following sectors:

1. **Housing**; Average prices in the Housing sector fell with 10.8 percent compared to February 2012, mainly as a result of decreases in the prices of Electricity, gas & other fuels (-15.3%), Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (-27.0%) and Maintenance & repair of dwellings (-3.1%).

2. **Clothing & footwear**; In February 2013, prices of Clothing & footwear declined by 9.2 percent compared to February 2012, mainly as a result of decreases in the average prices of Clothing (-10.2%) and Footwear (-1.0%).

3. **Household operation**; Average prices in the Household operation sector fell with 3.3 percent in February 2013. Lower prices were recorded for Furniture, furnishings, carpets & other floor coverings (-11.8%), Household textiles (-11.5%), Household appliances (-5.7%) and Glassware, tableware & household utensils (-10.2%).

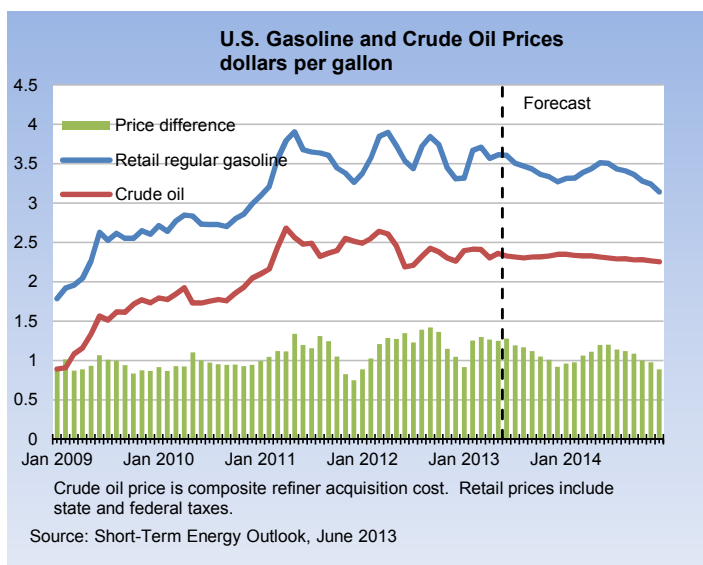

## Key points

In February 2013, the average WTI crude oil price rose by \$0.55 per barrel compared to the previous month, reaching \$95.31 per barrel. The Brent (Europe) crude oil reached \$116.05 per barrel in February 2013, up from \$112.96 per barrel recorded in January 2013.

In the beginning of February 2013, the Brent crude oil spot price increased to \$119 per barrel, then fell to \$97 per barrel in mid-April and recovered to an average of \$103 per barrel in May 2013. The EIA expects that the Brent crude oil spot price will average \$102 per barrel over the second half of 2013 and \$100 per barrel in 2014. Keep in mind that energy price forecasts are highly uncertain.

The EIA expects that regular gasoline retail prices, will average \$3.53 per gallon during the April-to-September period of 2013. The annual average gasoline retail price is projected to decrease from \$3.63 per gallon in 2012 to \$3.49 per gallon in 2013 and to \$3.37 per gallon in 2014.

U.S. diesel fuel retail prices are expected to average \$3.83 per gallon in the April-to-September period of 2013, down from an average of \$3.95 per gallon recorded in the similar period of 2012.

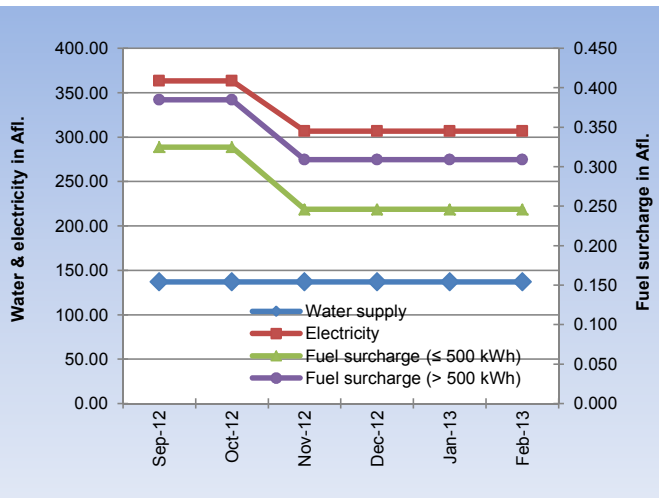

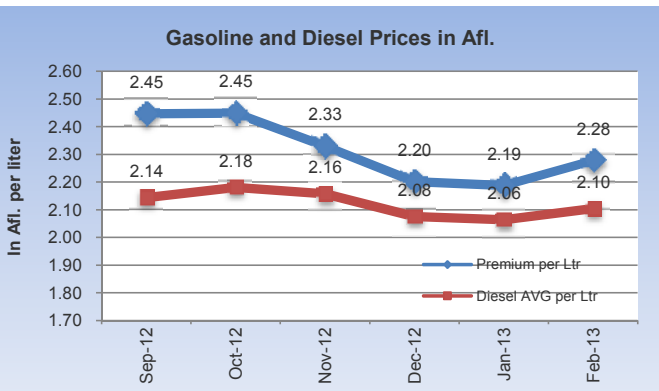

### Key points

In February 2013, the price of gasoline rose by Afl. 0.09 per liter compared to the previous month, reaching Afl. 2.28 per liter. The average price of diesel increased by Afl. 0.04 per liter, reaching Afl. 2.10 per liter in February 2013. In February 2013, the average prices per household of water and electricity remained unchanged when compared to the previous month.

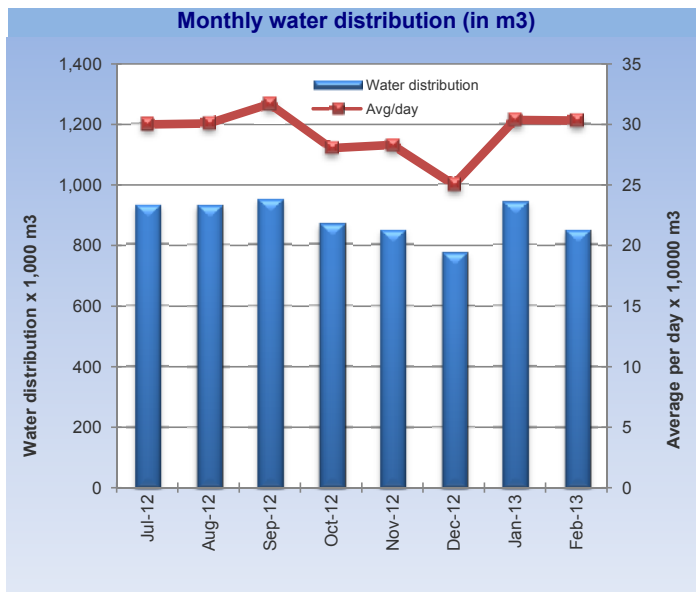

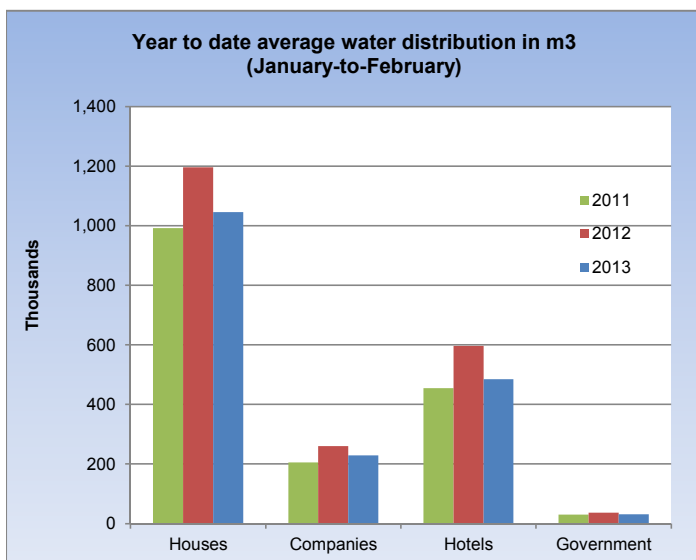

### Key points

In February 2013, the average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) decreased by 2.8 percent compared to February 2012. With the exception of Government (+9.3%), water usage decreases were recorded for all sectors, particularly, Houses (-1.2%), Companies (-0.1%) and Hotels (-7.8%).

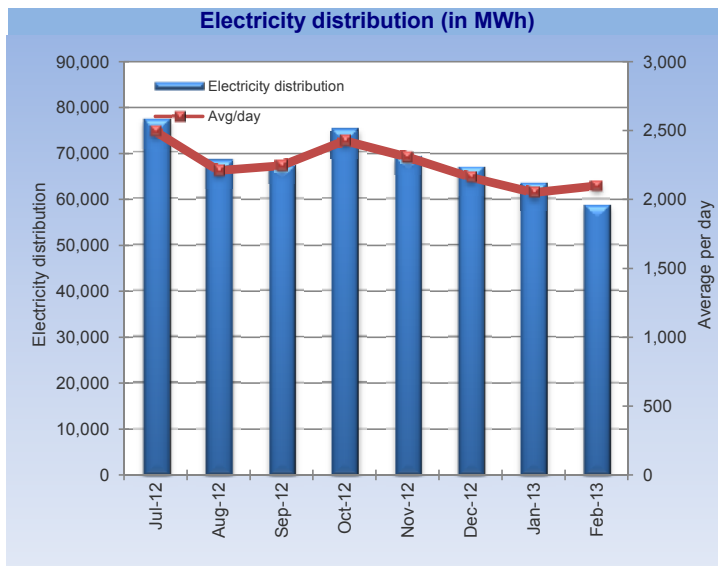

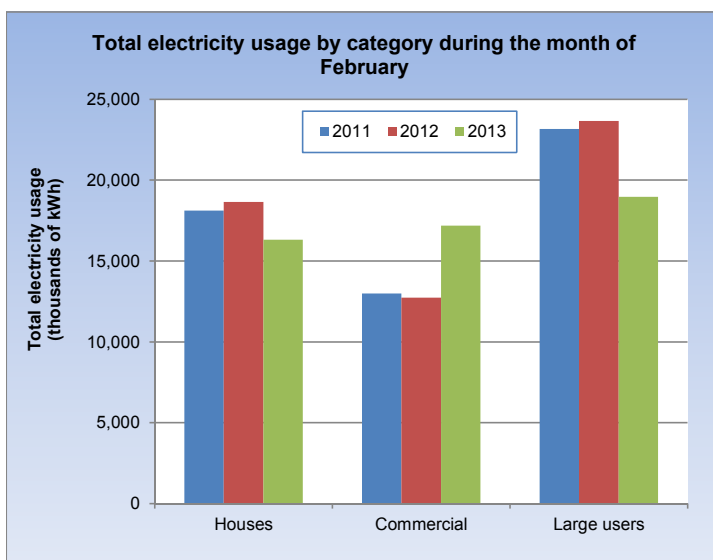

### Key points

In February 2013, electricity (in MWh) supplied to Elmar for distribution fell with 4.8 percent compared to February 2012, in contrast to an increase of 4.7 percent recorded during the similar period of the previous year.

The electricity consumption, as reported by the Elmar, decreased by 13.7 percent in February 2013, when compared to February 2012. In the January-to-February period of 2013, the total electricity usage fell with 0.4 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

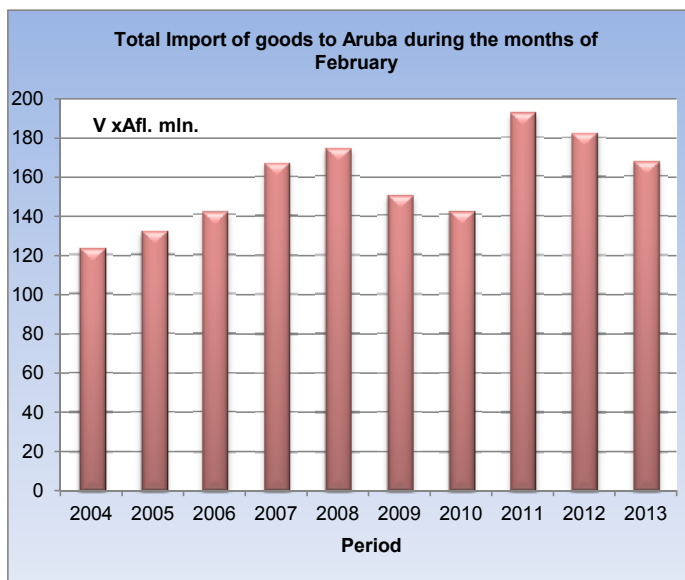

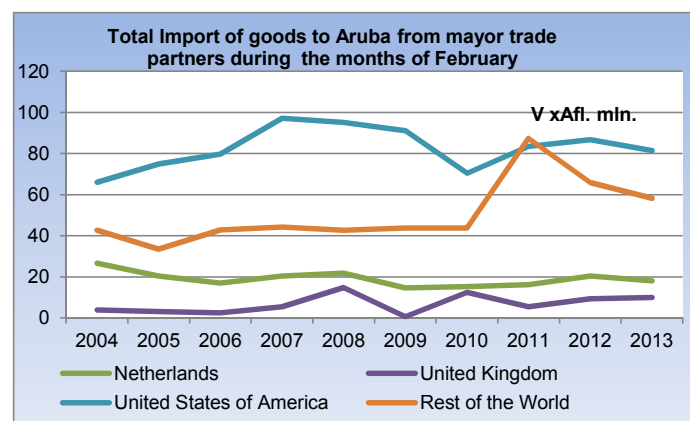

#### Key points

In February 2013, the total import of merchandise to Aruba declined by 8.1 percent compared to February 2012, following a drop of 5.3 percent recorded in the similar period one year earlier. With the exception of Other transportable goods (+3.0%), import decreases have been recorded for all commodities, particularly, Metal products, machinery & equipment (-13.1%), Mineral, chemical & related products (-11.4%), Agriculture products (-4.7%) and Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-13.5%).

In the January-to-February period of 2013, the total import of goods to Aruba rose by 4.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

Compared to February 2012, the total exports of goods from Aruba expanded by 12.2 percent in February 2013. With the exception of Metal products, machinery & equipment (-35.4%), export increases have been recorded for Agriculture products (+13.1%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+216.3%), Other transportable goods (+48.5%) and Mineral, chemical & related products (+74.7%).

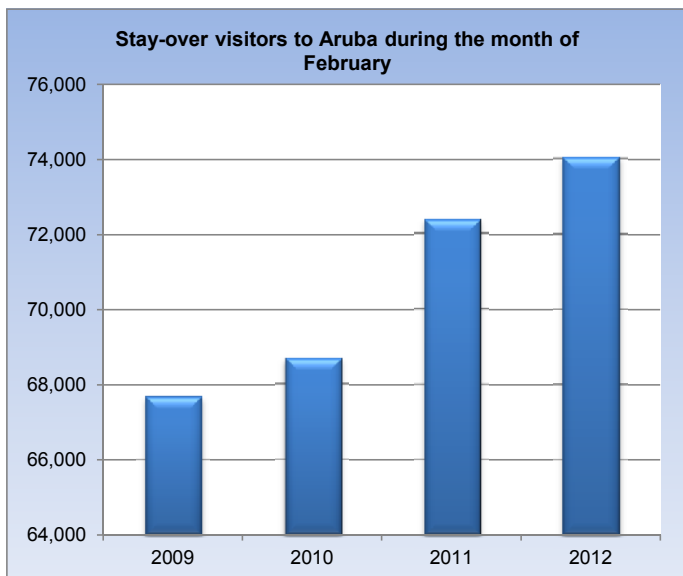

### Key points

In February 2013, the total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba increased by 2.3 percent compared to February 2012, following a 5.4 percent growth recorded during the similar period one year earlier. The main increases were recorded for the visitors from Venezuela (+33.1%), Chile (+124.1%), Norway (+539.4%), Sweden (+29.6%) and Argentina (+20.4%).

The share of the US market, which is the largest market, fell from 63.6 percent in February 2012 to 60.9 percent in February 2013. The Venezuelan market, the second largest market, recorded a market share of 12.6 percent in February 2013, up from 9.8 percent recorded in February 2012.

The number of cruise ship passengers declined by 5.7 percent in February 2013, when compared to February 2012. In the January-to-February period of 2013, the total cruise passengers rose by 9.7 percent compared to the similar period month of the previous year.
