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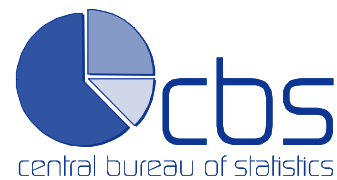


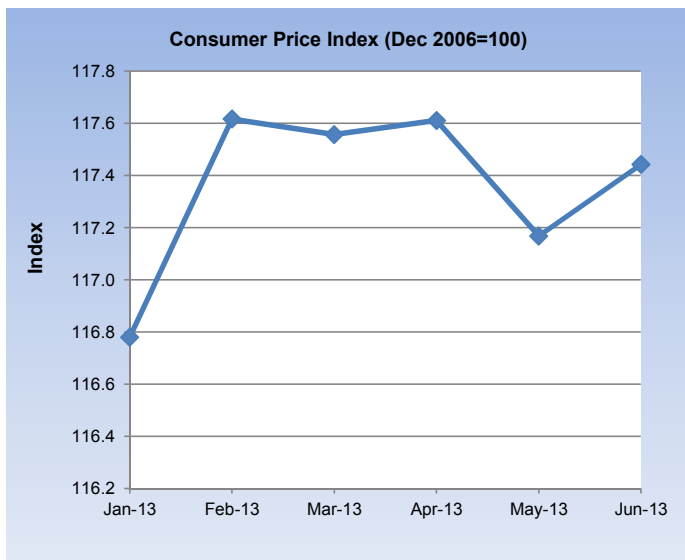

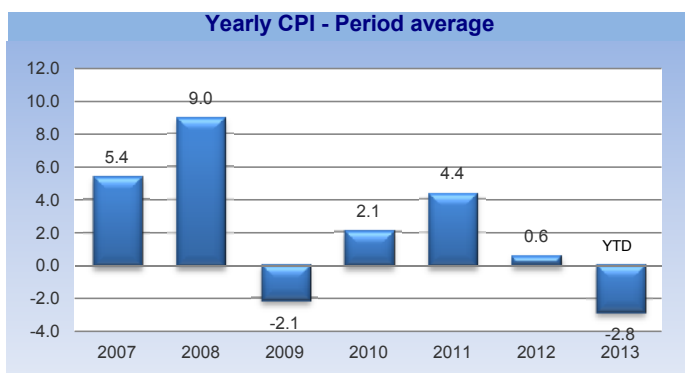

Key points

In June 2013, the total consumer price index increased by 0.2 percent compared to the previous month. With the exception of Health (-0.3%) and Miscellaneous goods & services (-0.1%), price increases were recorded for the sectors Clothing & footwear (+1.1%), Transport (+0.5%), Recreation & culture (+0.3%), Food & non-alcoholic beverages (+0.3%), Alcoholic beverages & tobacco (+0.1%) and Household operation (+0.1%). At the end of June 2013, the twelve-month average rate of inflation was at -2.8 percent, down from 4.8 percent recorded at the end of June 2012.

On a yearly basis, consumer prices decreased by 3.1 percent in June 2013. Major price decreases were recorded in the following sectors:

1. **Housing**; In June 2013, average prices in the Housing sector fell with 10.4 percent compared to June 2012, particularly as a result of decreases in the prices of Electricity, gas & other fuels (-15.3%) and Water supply & misc. services related to dwellings (-27.0%).

2. **Clothing & footwear**; Compared to June 2012, prices of Clothing & footwear dropped by 8.1 percent in June 2013, mainly as a result of decreases in the average prices of Clothing (-8.2%) and Footwear (-6.9%).

3. **Household operation**; Average prices in the Household operation sector declined by 1.4 percent in June 2013. Lower prices were recorded for Furniture, furnishings, carpets & other floor coverings (-6.2%), Household textiles (-11.0%), Household appliances (-2.6%) and Glassware, tableware & household utensils (-3.1%).

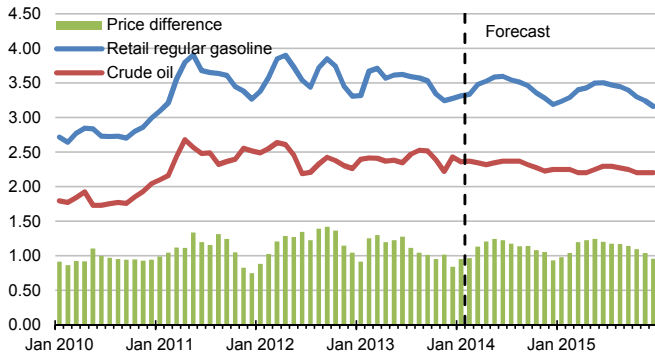

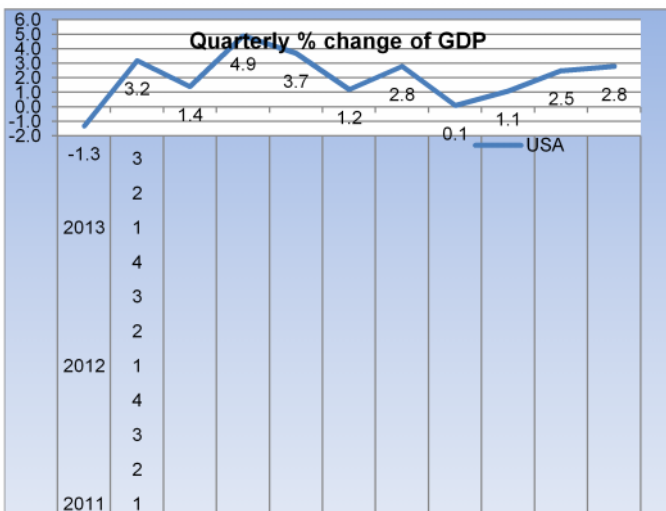

During the month of June 2013, the average WTI crude oil price increased by \$1.26 per barrel compared to the previous month, reaching \$95.77 per barrel. The Brent (Europe) crude oil reached \$102.92 per barrel in June 2013, up from \$102.56 per barrel recorded in May 2013.

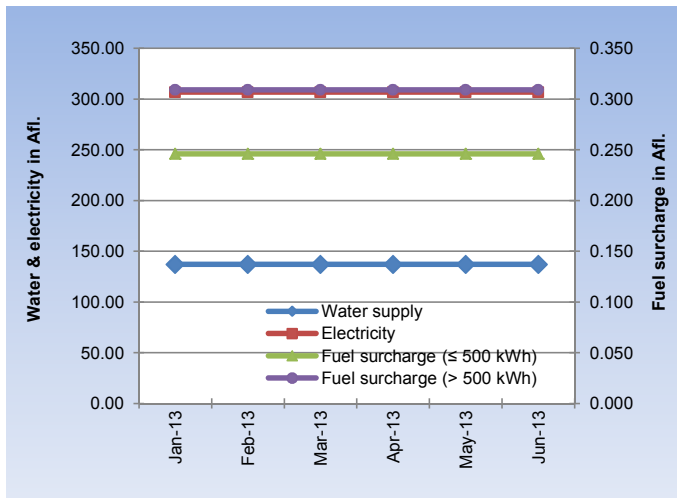

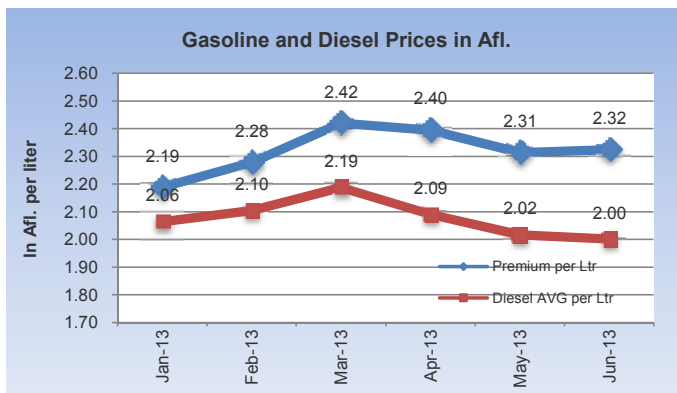

The average price of diesel fell with Afl. 0.02 per liter, reaching Afl. 2.00 per liter in June 2013. The average prices per household of water and electricity remained unchanged when compared to the previous month.

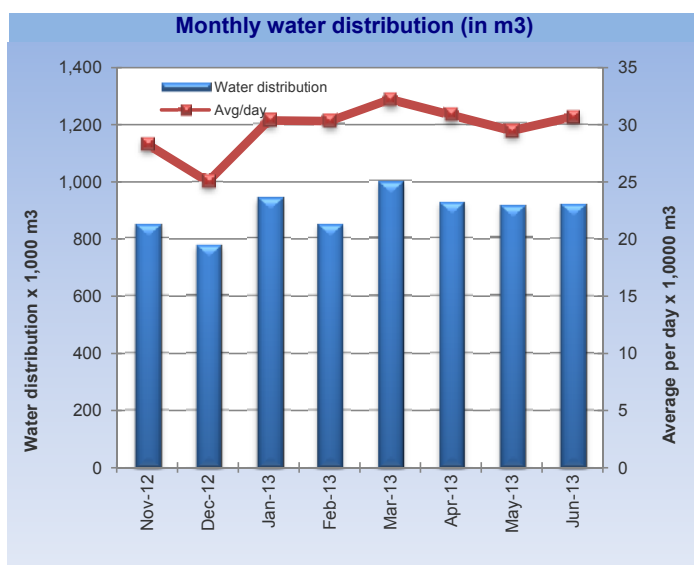

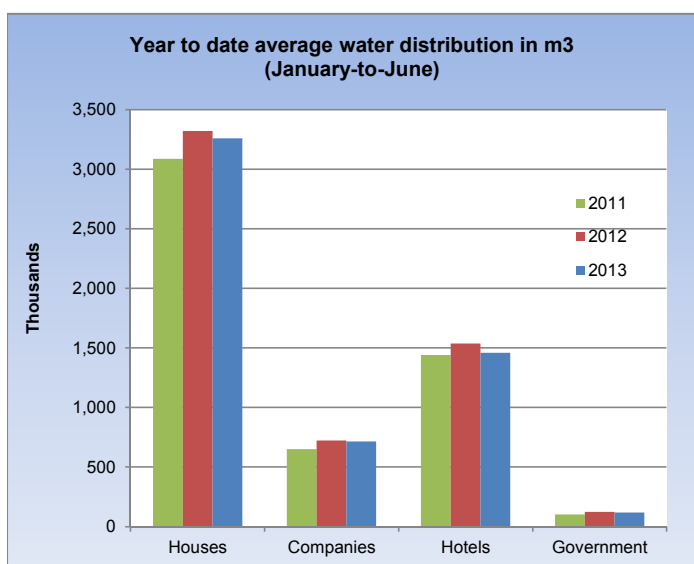

Key points

In June 2013, the average water distribution in Aruba (houses, companies, hotels, government) rose by 3.8 percent compared to June 2012. Water usage increases has been recorded for all sectors, particularly, Companies (+12.7%), Houses (+2.5%), Government (+16.5%) and Hotels (+1.3%).

During the first half of 2013, the average water distribution fell with 2.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

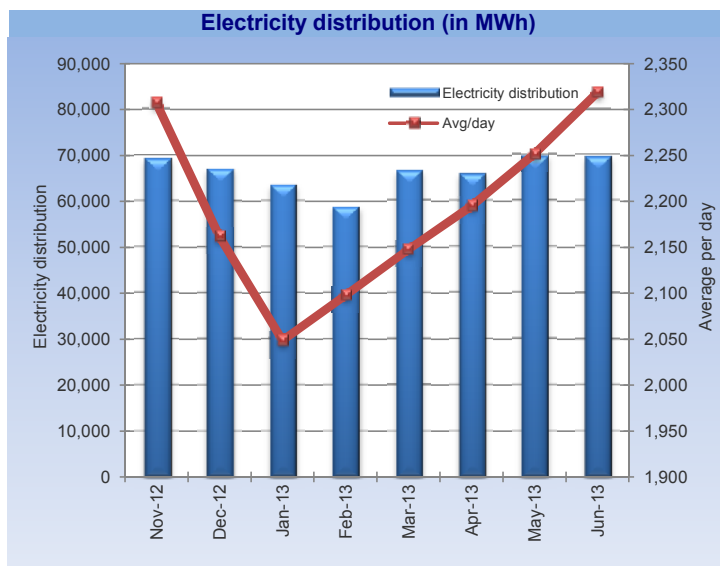

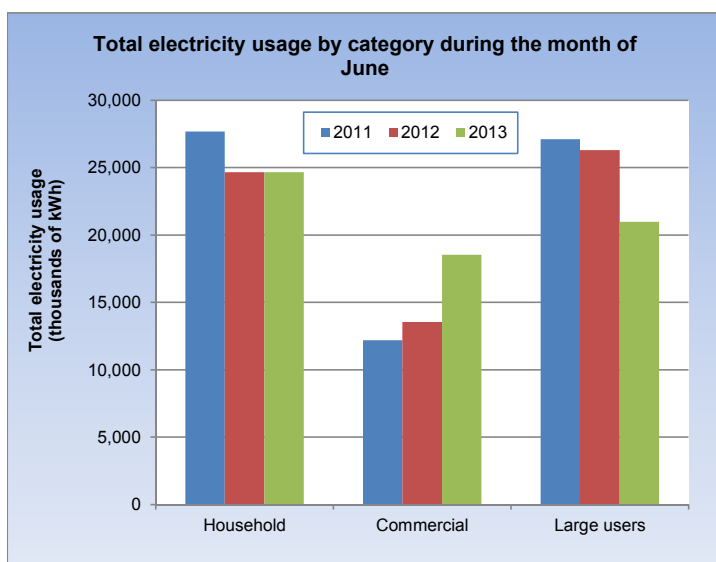

Key points

In June 2013, electricity in MWh supplied to Elmar increased by 5.0 percent compared to June 2012, in contrast to a 7.5 percent drop recorded during the similar period one year earlier.

The electricity consumption, as reported by the Elmar, increased by 0.7 percent in June 2013, when compared to June 2012. During the first six months of 2013, the total electricity usage is running 1.6 percent above the level recorded during the similar period of 2012.

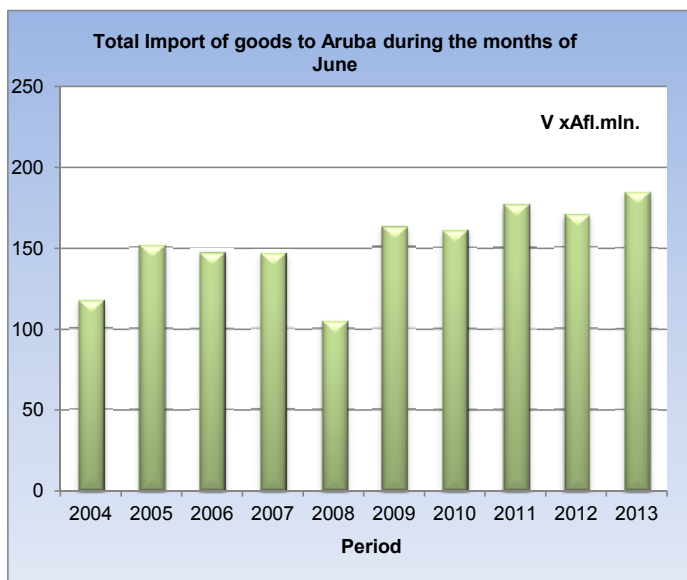

Key points

In June 2013, the total import of merchandise to Aruba rose by 8.4 percent compared to June 2012. Import increases were recorded for Agriculture products (+25.3%) and Textiles, pearls & precious stones (+20.6%). Imports of Mineral, chemical & related products, Metal products, machinery & equipment and Other transportable goods, on the other hand, fell with 5.0, 0.9 and 3.2 percent respectively, compared to June 2012.

During the first half of 2013, the total import of goods to Aruba increased by 4.6 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

Compared to June 2012, the total exports of goods from Aruba increased by 18.4 percent in June 2013. With the exception of Mineral, chemical & related products (-72.9%), Textiles, pearls & precious stones (-34.3%) and Metal products, machinery & equipment (-33.0%), export increases have been recorded for Agriculture products (+36.6%) and Other transportable goods (+4.0%).

In the January-to-June period of 2013, total export of goods from Aruba increased by 9.4 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

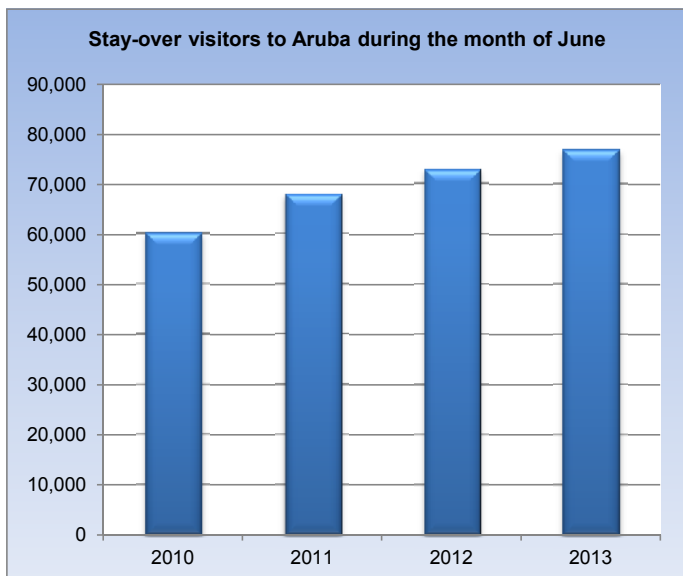

Key points

The total number of stay-over visitors to Aruba recorded an increase of 5.6 percent in June 2013, when compared to June 2012. The main increases were recorded for the visitors from USA (+8.8%), Venezuela (+15.5%), Argentina (+26.5%) and Colombia (+7.5%).

Year to date

In the January-to-June period of 2013, the total number of visitors to Aruba increased by 5.4 percent compared to the similar period of 2012. During the first six months of 2013, the number of cruise passengers increased by 13.7 percent compared to the similar period of 2012.

The share of the US market, which is the largest market, fell from 63.9 percent in June 2012 to 62.6 percent in June 2013. The Venezuelan market, the second largest market, recorded a market share of 13.2 percent in June 2013, up from 11.6 percent recorded in June 2012.
