

## Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006 April 2014

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of April 2014.

The CPI for April 2014 is 117.17, an increase of 0.1% compared to the index of March 2014 (117.11) and accumulating an increase of 0.2% up to and including April of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (April 2013 to April 2014) is -0.4, an increase of 3.1 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-3.5).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period April 2013 - April 2014 is -1.4, an increase of 0.7 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period April 2012 - April 2013 (-2.1).

During this month, six of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" sector (0.2%), "Clothing and footwear" sector (0.7%) and "Housing" (0.1%), causing an effect of 0.04, 0.03 and 0.02 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.02 ppts on the CPI of April 2014.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by decreases in the indices for the "Recreation and culture" sector (-0.3%) and "Household operation" sector (-0.3%), which had an influence of -0.02 ppts each. The decreases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of -0.02 ppts on the CPI of April 2014.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (0.5%), which contributed to an effect of 0.05 ppts. The increase in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was caused by an increase in the category "Clothing" (0.8%), which contributed to an effect of 0.04 ppts. The increase in the "Housing" sector was mainly caused by an increase in the category "Actual rentals for housing" (0.1%), which contributed to an effect of 0.02 ppts.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was due to decreases of 2.7% and 0.4% in the categories "Audio-visual, photographic and information processing equipment" and "Other recreational items and equipment; gardens and pets", which contributed to an effect of -0.02 and -0.01 ppts, respectively. The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly caused by a decrease in the category "Household appliances" (-3.0%), which contributed to an effect of -0.02 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to March 2014, 34.3% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.36 ppts, while 31.4% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.31 ppts and the remaining 34.3% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.03% and caused an influence of 0.02 ppts. The prices of services show an increase of 0.1% and had an influence of 0.03 ppts. The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in April 2014 an increase of 0.2%, which is 0.6 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.4%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered a decrease of 7.0%, which is 1.5 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-8.5%). The food index shows a decrease of 0.02%, which is 0.9 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.9%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years) in April 2014 is Afl. 4,275, while for a single adult household the amount is Afl. 2,036.



## Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in April 2014

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In April 2014 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 102.31) had an increase of US\$ 1.55 (1.5%) compared to March 2014 (US\$ 100.76).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in April 2014, it stayed at Afl. 24.60 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in April 2014, it stayed at Afl. 30.90 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to March 2014. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 306.75, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In April 2014 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 0.02 (1.0%) causing an effect of 0.07 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 0.03 (-1.5%) and had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of April 2014.

In April 2014, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 0.3% compared to March 2014, and had an influence of 0.06 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease of 0.01% in price, causing an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI.

## Change in prices of Food & catering services in April 2014

The "Food & catering services" index shows a slight increase of 0.03% in April 2014, after an increase of 0.4% in March 2014. The index for "Food at home" shows a small increase of 0.02% in April, as four of the eleven "Food at home" indices increased in April 2014. The "Milk, cheese and eggs" index registered the largest increase (0.8%) in April and was mainly caused by increases of 5.0% and 1.1% in the indices for "Eggs" and "Cheese". Furthermore, increases of 0.3%, 0.3% and 0.2% were posted in the indices for "Food products n.e.c.", "Bread and cereals" and "Non-alcoholic beverages", respectively. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest decrease (-1.2%), followed by a decrease of 0.5% in the indices for "Fish and other seafood" and "Oils and fats".

Over the last 12 months the "Food & catering services" index has increased by 1.2%. The "Food at home" index shows an increase of 0.7%. The "Milk, cheese and eggs" index increased by 4.2%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Vegetables" index shows the largest decrease (7.1%).

The index for "Food away from home" shows an increase of 0.1% in April, after an increase of 0.7% in March 2014 and has increased by 2.8% over the last 12 months.

In April 2014, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show an increase in price of 0.03% compared to March 2014, and had an influence of 0.01 ppt on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.1%, causing an effect of 0.05 ppts on the CPI.
