

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006

September 2014

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of September 2014.

The CPI for September 2014 is 117.82, a decrease of 0.2% compared to the index of August 2014 (118.01) and accumulating an increase of 0.7% (year-to-date) up to and including September of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (September 2013 to September 2014) is 0.2, an increase of 1.7 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-1.5).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period September 2013 - September 2014 is -0.2, an increase of 2.7 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period September 2012 - September 2013 (-2.9).

During this month, six of the twelve sectors registered decreases in prices. The decreases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (-1.3%) and "Recreation and culture" (-1.4%) sectors, causing an effect of -0.25 and -0.12 ppts, respectively. The decrease in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.10 ppts on the CPI of September 2014.

Aforementioned decreases were partially offset mainly by increases in the indices for the "Housing" (0.6%) and "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (0.5%) sectors, which had an influence of 0.17 and 0.07 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had a total effect of 0.06 ppts on the CPI of September 2014.

The decrease in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to decreases in the categories "Transport services" (-8.8%) and "Operation of personal transport equipment" (-1.2%), which contributed to an effect of -0.13 and -0.12 ppts, respectively.

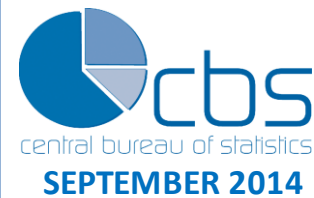
The increase in the "Housing" sector was mainly due to an increase of 4.1% in the category "Maintenance and repair of the dwelling", which contributed to an effect of 0.16 ppts. The increase in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was caused by increases of 0.3% and 1.7% in the categories "Food" and "Non-alcoholic beverages", which contributed to an effect of 0.04 and 0.03 ppts, respectively.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to August 2014, 30.8% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.50 ppts, while 34.5% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.67 ppts and the remaining 34.7% had no change in price. The prices of goods were virtually unchanged and had an insignificant influence on the CPI of September 2014. The prices of services show a decrease of 0.5% and had an influence of -0.16 ppts.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food - registered in September 2014 an increase of 0.1%, which had no change compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.1%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel - registered a decrease of 1.5%, which is 11.6 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-13.1%). The food index shows an increase of 0.8%, which is 0.9 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.1%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years) in September 2014 is Afl. 4,311, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,053.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in September 2014

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In September 2014 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 93.29) had a decrease of US\$ 4.32 (-4.4%) compared to August 2014 (US\$ 97.61).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in September 2014, it stayed at Afl. 24.60 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in September 2014, it stayed at Afl. 30.90 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to August 2014. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 306.75, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In September 2014 the price of gasoline decreased by Afl. 0.04 (-1.8%) causing an effect of -0.12 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 0.01 (-0.3%) and had an insignificant effect on the CPI of September 2014.

In September 2014, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show a decrease in price of 0.6% compared to August 2014, and had an influence of -0.12 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease of 0.05% in price, causing an effect of -0.04 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in September 2014

The "Food & catering services" index shows an increase of 0.4% in September 2014, after an increase of 0.4% in August 2014. The index for "Food at home" shows an increase of 0.5% in September, as six of the eleven "Food at home" indices increased in September 2014. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest increase (5.8%) in September and was mainly caused by an increase of 8.0% in the index for "Potatoes". Furthermore, increases of 1.7%, 1.2% and 0.9% were posted in the indices for "Non-alcoholic beverages", "Vegetables" and "Fruit", respectively. The "Fish and other seafood" index registered the largest decrease (-0.7%), followed by decreases of 0.4%, 0.3% and 0.3% in the indices for "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery", "Food products n.e.c." and "Milk, cheese and eggs".

Over the last 12 months the "Food & catering services" index has increased by 2.5%. The "Food at home" index shows an increase of 2.5%. The "Food products n.e.c." index increased by 5.8%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Potatoes and other tubers" index shows the largest decrease (-3.3%).

The index for "Food away from home" shows a slight increase of 0.04% in September, after an increase of 0.8% in August 2014 and has increased by 2.7% over the last 12 months.

In September 2014, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show an increase in price of 0.4% compared to August 2014, and had an influence of 0.07 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.3%, causing an effect of -0.24 ppts on the CPI.

The subsistence level in September 2014

The subsistence level is the minimum level of income which is perceived necessary to achieve an adequate standard of living in a given country. The subsistence level is usually determined by estimating the cost of all the essential resources that an average adult consumes in one month or year. This is commonly called a basic needs index, and varies according to the price of food, clothing, housing, transport and other items in the "basket". Equivalence scales are used to adjust for the assumed standard of living, of households of different sizes and composition. The scale assigns a weight of 1.0 for the first adult and 0.5 for each additional adult in the household (aged 15+) and a weight of 0.3 for each child (aged 0-14 years). The subsistence level is based on figures of the report "Bestaansminimum 2010" published by the CBS in November 2010 and is monthly updated for inflation using the monthly CPI. The reference unit used in this report is a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years).

In September 2014 the subsistence level for a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years) (Afl. 4,311) shows an increase of Afl. 40 compared to September 2013 (Afl. 4,271) and was mainly caused by an increase of Afl. 38 in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector.

In September 2014 the subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl 2,053, which represents an income deficit of Afl. 416, an increase of Afl. 19 compared to the deficit observed one year ago (Afl. 397). This deficit is the second lowest registered over a period of five years for the month September.
