

Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006

May 2016

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of May 2016.

The CPI for May 2016 is 116.97, an increase of 0.4% compared to the index of April 2016 (116.54) and accumulating a decrease of 1.2% up to and including May of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last 12 months (May 2015 to May 2016) is -1.6%, a decrease of 2.7 percentage points (ppt) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (1.1%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period May 2015 - May 2016 is -0.5%, a decrease of 1.5 ppt compared to the period average percentage change over the period May 2014 - May 2015 (1.0%).

During this month, eight of the twelve sectors registered increases in prices. The increases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (1.1%), "Recreation and culture" (1.6%) and "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (0.3%) sectors, causing an effect of 0.18, 0.13 and 0.05 ppt, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.06 ppt on the CPI of May 2016.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by decreases in the indices for the "Household operation" (-0.3%) and "Housing" (-0.1%) sectors, which both had an influence of -0.02 ppt on the CPI of May 2016. The decrease in the remaining sector had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of May 2016.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was caused by an increase of 2.4% in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment", which contributed to an effect of 0.19 ppt. The increase in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Holidays" (16.9%), which contributed to an effect of 0.10 ppt. The increase in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was due to increase in the categories "Non-alcoholic beverages" (1.6%) and "Food" (0.1%), which contributed to an effect of 0.03 and 0.02 ppt, respectively.

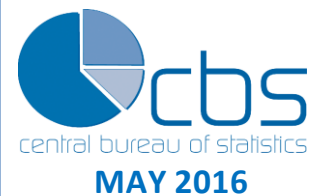
The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to a decrease of 2.8% in the category "Household appliances", which contributed to an effect of -0.02 ppt. The decrease in the "Housing" sector was caused by a decrease of 0.8% in the category "Maintenance and repair of the dwelling", which contributed to an effect of -0.03 ppt.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to April 2016, 35.0% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.68 ppt, while 28.3% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.31 ppt and the remaining 36.7% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.4% and caused an influence of 0.23 ppt. The prices of services show an increase of 0.4% and had an influence of 0.14 ppt on the CPI of May 2016.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 0.8% in May 2016, which is 0.1 ppt lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.9%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – is -5.1%, which is 4.8 ppt lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.3%). The food index shows a slight decrease of 0.04%, which is 3.7 ppt lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (3.7%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two adults and two children (aged 0-14 years) in May 2016 is Afl. 4,331, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,062.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in May 2016

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In May 2016 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 46.59) had an increase of US\$ 6.40 (15.9%) compared to April 2016 (US\$ 40.19).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in May 2016, it stayed at Afl. 21.90 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in May 2016, it stayed at Afl. 27.80 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to April 2016. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 308.76, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In May 2016 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 6.20 cents (3.8%) causing an effect of 0.18 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 3.20 cents (2.6%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of May 2016.

In May 2016, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 1.0% compared to April 2016, and had an influence of 0.19 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase of 0.2% in price, causing an effect of 0.19 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in May 2016

The “Food & catering services” index shows an increase of 0.4% in May 2016, after a decrease of 0.2% in April 2016. The index for “Food at home” shows an increase of 0.3% in May, as seven of the eleven “Food at home” indices increased in May 2016. The “Non-alcoholic beverages” index registered the largest increase (1.6%) in May 2016. Furthermore, increases of 0.8%, 0.8% and 0.6% were posted in the indices for “Fruit”, “Fish and other seafood” and “Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery”, respectively. The “Potatoes and other tubers” index registered the largest increase (-4.5%). Furthermore, decreases of 0.4% and 0.1% were posted in the indices for “Vegetables” and “Food products n.e.c.”.

Over the last 12 months the “Food & catering services” index has increased by 0.3%. The “Food at home” index shows a slight decrease of 0.02%. The “Milk, cheese and eggs” and “Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery” indices decreased by 6.3%, the largest decreases among the “Food at home” food groups, while the “Food products n.e.c.” index shows the largest increase (6.0%).

The index for “Food away from home” shows an increase of 0.6% in May 2016, after a slight increase of 0.04% in April 2016 and has increased by 1.4% over the last 12 months.

In May 2016, “Food at home” and “Food away from home” as a group show an increase in price of 0.4% compared to April 2016, and had an influence of 0.07 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.4%, causing an effect of 0.30 ppts on the CPI.
