

**Press Release Consumer Price Index June 2016** 

### Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006

June 2016

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of June 2016.

The CPI for June 2016 is 117.44, an increase of 0.4% compared to the index of May 2016 (116.97) and accumulating a decrease of 0.8% for the year 2016 up to and including June.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (June 2015 to June 2016) is -0.8%, a decrease of 1.5 percentage points (ppt) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.7%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period June 2015 - June 2016 is -0.6%, a decrease of 1.6 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period June 2014 - June 2015 (1.0%).


During this month, all of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increases which had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (1.3%), "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (0.4%), "Communications" 0.6% and "Clothing and footwear" (0.5%) sectors, causing an effect of 0.23, 0.05 0.03 and 0.03 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.06 ppts on the CPI of June 2016.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was caused by increases of 2.1% and 3.7% in the categories "Operation of personal transport equipment" and "Transport services", which contributed to an effect of 0.18 and 0.05 ppts, respectively. The increase in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Food" (0.3%), which contributed to an effect of 0.04 ppts. The increase in the "Communications" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Telephone and telefax services" (0.5%), which contributed to an effect of 0.03ppts. The increase in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was mainly caused by an increase of 0.6% in the category "Clothing", which contributed to an effect of 0.02 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to May 2016, 33.0% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.64 ppts, while 30.1% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.24 ppts and the remaining 36.9% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.4% and caused an influence of 0.26 ppts. The prices of services show an increase of 0.4% and had an influence of 0.14 ppts on the CPI of June 2016.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 0.8% in June 2016, which is 0.2 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (1.0%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – is -5.7%, which is 5.3 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.4%). The food index shows a slight decrease of 0.03%, which is 3.6 ppts lower compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (3.6%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in June 2016 is Afl. 4,344, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,069.

## Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in June 2016

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In June 2016 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 48.95) had an increase of US\$ 2.36 (5.1%) compared to May 2016 (US\$ 46.59).

Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in June 2016, it stayed at Afl. 21.90 cents per kWh. Fuel surcharge for a usage of electricity between 501 -1000 kWh did not change in June 2016, it stayed at Afl. 27.80 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to May 2016. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 308.76, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In June 2016 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 5.80 cents (3.5%) causing an effect of 0.17 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 9.60 cents (7.6%) and had an effect of 0.02 ppts on the CPI of June 2016.

In June 2016, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group show an increase in price of 1.0% compared to May 2016, and had an influence of 0.18 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase of 0.3% in price, causing an effect of 0.22 ppts on the CPI.

# Change in prices of Food & catering services in June 2016

The "Food & catering services" index shows an increase of 0.3% in June 2016, after an increase of 0.4% in May 2016. The index for "Food at home" shows an increase of 0.4% in June, as eight (8) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices increased in June 2016. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest increase (3.7%) in June 2016. Furthermore, increases of 2.5%, 1.2% and 0.7% were posted in the indices for "Vegetables", "Fruit" and "Non-alcoholic beverages", respectively. The "Meat" index registered the largest decrease (-0.5%). Furthermore, decreases of 0.3% and 0.1% were posted in the indices for "Milk, cheese and eggs" and "Bread and cereals".

Over the last twelve (12) months the "Food & catering services" index has increased by 1.1%. The "Food at home" index shows an increase of 0.9%. The "Fruit" index increased by 9.3%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Milk, cheese and eggs" index shows the largest decrease (-6.3%).

The index for "Food away from home" shows an increase of 0.2% in June 2016, after an increase of 0.6% in May 2016 and has increased by 1.6% over the last twelve (12) months.

In June 2016, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group show an increase in price of 0.3% compared to May 2016, and had an influence of 0.06 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 0.4%, causing an effect of 0.34 ppts on the CPI.

### The subsistence level in June 2016

The subsistence level is the minimum level of income which is perceived necessary to achieve an adequate standard of living in a given country. The subsistence level is usually determined by estimating the cost of all the essential resources that an average adult consumes in one month or year. This is commonly called a basic needs index, and varies according to the price of food, clothing, housing, transport and other items in the "basket". Equivalent scales are used to adjust the assumed standard of living, of households of different sizes and composition. The scale assigns a weight of 1.0 for the first adult and 0.5 for each additional adult in the household (aged 15+) and a weight of 0.3 for each child (aged 0-14 years). The subsistence level is based on figures of the report "Bestaansminimum 2010" published by the CBS in June 2010 and is monthly updated for inflation using the monthly CPI. The reference unit used in this report is a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years).

In June 2016 the monthly subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) (Afl. 4,344) shows a decrease of Afl. 14 compared to June 2015 (Afl. 4,358) and was mainly caused by a decrease of Afl. 36 in the sector "Housing".

In June 2016 the monthly subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl 2,069, which represents an income deficit of Afl. 391, a decrease of Afl. 47 compared to the deficit observed one year ago (Afl. 438). This deficit is the lowest registered over a period of five (5) years for the month June.
