Consumer Price Index, base period December 2006

August 2018

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of August 2018.

The CPI for August 2018 is 122.16, a decrease of 0.2% compared to the index of July 2018 (122.47) and accumulating an increase of 3.9% up to and including August of this year. The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (August 2017 to August 2018) is 5.0%, an increase of 5.7 ppts compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-0.7%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period August 2017 - August 2018 is 1.8%, an increase of 2.2 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period August 2016 - August 2017 (-0.4%).

During this month, five (5) of the twelve (12) sectors registered decreases in prices. The decreases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Recreation and culture" (-3.2%), "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" (-0.5%) and the "Transport" (-0.3%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of -0.27, -0.07 and -0.06 ppts, respectively. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an insignificant effect on the CPI of August 2018.

Aforementioned decreases were partially offset mainly by increases in the indices for the "Clothing and footwear" (1.2%) and "Household operation" (0.8%) sectors, causing an effect of 0.06 and 0.05 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.05 ppts on the CPI of August 2018.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Holidays" (-21.9%), which contributed to an effect of -0.21 ppts. The decrease in the "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" sector was caused by a decrease of 0.7% in the category "Food", which contributed to an effect of -0.09 ppts. The decrease in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Transport services" (-8.3%), which contributed to an effect of -0.12 ppts.

The increase in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was mainly due to an increase of 1.1% in the category "Clothing", which contributed to an effect of 0.05 ppts. The increase in the "Household operation" sector was mainly caused by an increase in the category "Household appliances" (2.7%), which contributed to an effect of 0.02 ppts.

The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 452 goods and services. Compared to July 2018, 44.9% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.63 ppts, while 27.2% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.87 ppts and the remaining 27.9% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.02% and caused an influence of 0.01 ppt. The prices of services showed a decrease of 0.7% and had an influence of -0.26 ppts on the CPI of August 2018.

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 1.4% in August 2018, which is 0.9 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.5%). The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was 1.3%, which is 5.7 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-4.4%). The food index showed an increase of 4.8%, which is 3.9 ppts higher compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (0.9%).

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in August 2018 is Afl. 4,529, while for a single adult household it is Afl. 2,157.

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in August 2018

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In August 2018 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 68.25) had a decrease of US\$ 2.91 (-4.1%) compared to July 2018 (US\$ 71.16).

The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity up to 500 kWh did not change in August 2018, it stayed at Afl. 34.52 cents per kWh. The total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity between 501 - 1000 kWh did not change in August 2018, it stayed at Afl. 35.72 cents per kWh. Additionally, the total energy charge per kWh for the usage of electricity above 1000 kWh did not change in August 2018, it stayed at Afl. 45.93 cents per kWh. The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to July 2018. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 265.65, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In August 2018 the price of gasoline increased by Afl. 2.30 cents (1.1%) causing an effect of 0.06 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 0.10 cents (-0.1%) and had an insignificant effect on the CPI of August 2018.

In August 2018, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed an increase in price of 0.4% compared to July 2018, and had an influence of 0.06 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 448 goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease of 0.4% in price, causing an effect of -0.31 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in **August 2018**

The "Food & catering services" index showed a decrease of 0.2% in August 2018, after an increase of 2.1% in July 2018. The index for "Food at home" showed a decrease of 0.5% in August, as two (2) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices decreased in August 2018. The "Fruit" index registered the largest decrease (-8.0%) in August 2018. Furthermore, a decrease was posted in the index for "Fish and other seafood" (-1.1%). Furthermore, increases of 13.7% and 1.5% were posted in the indices for "Potatoes and other tubers" and "Bread and cereals".

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 8.2%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 9.5%. The "Fruit" index increased by 28.8%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" increased by 0.7% in August 2018 and has increased by 3.9% over the last twelve (12) months.

In August 2018, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed a decrease in price of 0.2% compared to July 2018, and had an influence of -0.04 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.3%, causing an effect of -0.21 ppts on the CPI.
