

Consumer Price Index, base period June 2019 February 2021

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of February 2021.

Consumer Price Index for the month of February 2021

The CPI for February 2021 is 97.00, an increase of 0.1% compared to the index of January 2021 (96.89) and accumulating a decrease of 0.1% up to and including February of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (February 2020 to February 2021) is -1.9, a decrease of 4.2 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (2.3%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period February 2020 - February 2021 is -2.2%, a decrease of 6.1 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period February 2019 - February 2020 (3.9%).

During this month, four (4) of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increase that had the greatest influence on the CPI was registered for the "Transport" (2.2%) sector, which contributed with an effect of 0.27 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.02 ppts on the CPI of February 2021.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by decreases in the indices for the "Restaurants and hotels" (-2.2%), "Recreation and culture" (-0.3%) and "Clothing and footwear" (-0.8%) sectors, causing an effect of -0.10, -0.03 and 0.02 ppts, respectively. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.03 ppts on the CPI of February 2021.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (3.5%), which contributed to an effect of 0.26 ppts.

The decrease in the "Restaurants and hotels" sector was due to a decrease in the category "Accommodation services" (-59.8%), which contributed to an effect of -0.10 ppts. The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly caused by a decrease of 1.3% in the category "Holidays", which contributed to an effect of -0.04 ppts. The decrease in the "Clothing and footwear" sector was due to decreases in the categories "Footwear" (-1.4%) and "Clothing" (-0.7%), which each contributed with an effect of -0.01 ppts.

Consumption basket


The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 408 goods and services. Compared to January 2021, 43.6% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 0.57 ppts, while 36.8% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.46 ppts and the remaining 19.6% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 0.4% and caused an influence of 0.22 ppts. The prices of services showed a decrease of 0.3% and had an influence of -0.11 ppts on the CPI of February 2021.

Core inflation

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was -0.9% in February 2021. The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was -7.9%. The food index showed a decrease of -2.0%.

Subsistence level

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-15 years) in February 2021 is Afl. 4,742, a decrease of Afl. 94 compared to February 2020 (Afl. 4,836). The subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl. 2,258, a decrease of Afl. 45 compared to February 2020 (Afl. 2,303).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in February 2021

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In February 2021 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 59.10) had an increase of US\$ 7.87 (15.4%) compared to January 2021 (US\$ 51.23).

The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to January 2021. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 240.09, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In February 2021 the price of gasoline registered an increase of Afl. 10.40 cents (5.6%) and had an effect of 0.22 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 6.20 cents (4.1%) and had an effect of 0.01 ppt on the CPI of February 2021.

In February 2021, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed an increase in price of 1.5% compared to January 2021, and had an influence of 0.23 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 404 goods and services, as a group, show a decrease of 0.1% and had an effect of -0.12 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in February 2021

The "Food & catering services" index showed a slight decrease of 0.04% in February 2021, the fourth consecutive decrease. The index for "Food at home" showed a decrease of 0.1% in February, as four (4) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices decreased in February 2021. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest decrease (-10.7%) in February 2021. Furthermore, decreases were posted in the indices for "Vegetables" (-2.7%), "Bread and cereals" (-1.1%) and "Non-alcoholic beverages" (-0.1%).

The "Fruit" (1.5%) index registered the largest increase in February 2021. Furthermore, increases were posted in the indices for "Fish and other seafood" (1.3%) and "Meat" (0.9%).

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has decreased by 1.6%. The "Food at home" index showed a decrease of 2.6%. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index decreased by 18.3%, the largest decrease among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery" index increased by 1.8%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" did not change in February 2021 and has increased by 0.9% over the last twelve (12) months.

In February 2021, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed a slight decrease in price of 0.04% compared to January 2021, and had an influence of -0.01 ppt on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.1%, causing an effect of 0.12 ppts on the CPI.
