

# Consumer Price Index, base period June 2019 January 2022

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of January 2022.

### Consumer Price Index for the month of January 2022

The CPI for January 2022 is 100.07, a decrease of 0.5% compared to the index of December 2021 (100.60).

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (January 2021 to January 2022) is 3.3, an increase of 6.0 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (-2.7%).

The period average percentage change of the CPI for the period January 2021 - January 2022 is 1.2%, an increase of 3.0 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the period January 2020 - January 2021 (-1.8%).

During this month, three (3) of the twelve (12) sectors registered decreases in prices. The decreases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Recreation and culture" (-4.7%) and "Household operation" (-5.0%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of -0.48 and -0.47 ppts, respectively. The decrease in the remaining sector had an effect of -0.03 ppts on the CPI of January 2022.

Aforementioned decreases were partially offset mainly by an increase in the index for the "Housing" (0.7%) sector, causing an effect of 0.17 ppts. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.28 ppts on the CPI of January 2022.

The decrease in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to decreases in the categories "Holidays" (-10.2%) and "Audio-visual, photographic and information processing equipment" (-28.7%), which contributed to an effect of -0.31 and -0.21 ppts, respectively. The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to decreases in the categories "Tools and equipment for house and garden" (-20.4%) and "Furniture, furnishings, carpets and other floor coverings" (-15.8%), which contributed to an effect of -0.18 and -0.16 ppts, respectively.

The increase in the "Housing" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Maintenance and repair of the dwelling" (3.2%), which contributed to an effect of 0.16 ppts.

#### **Consumption basket**


The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 408 goods and services. Compared to December 2021, 48.0% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 1.33 ppts, while 34.8% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -1.87 ppts and the remaining 17.2% had no change in price. The prices of goods decreased by 0.6% and caused an influence of -0.33 ppts. The prices of services showed a decrease of 0.5% and had an influence of -0.21 ppts on the CPI of January 2022.

#### **Core inflation**

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 0.1% in January 2022. The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was 7.5%. The food index showed an increase of 0.4%.

### Subsistence level

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in January 2022 is Afl. 4,920, an increase of Afl. 181 compared to January 2021 (Afl. 4,739). The subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl. 2,343, an increase of Afl. 86 compared to January 2021 (Afl. 2,257).

# Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in January 2022

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In January 2022 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 83.06) had an increase of US\$ 11.65 (16.3%) compared to December 2021 (US\$ 71.41).

The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to December 2021. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 240.09, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In January 2022 the price of gasoline registered a decrease of Afl. 8.40 cents (-3.5%) and had an effect of -0.17 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered a decrease of Afl. 7.30 cents (-3.6%) and had an effect of -0.01 ppt on the CPI of January 2022.

In January 2022, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed a decrease in price of 1.1% compared to December 2021, and had an influence of -0.18 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 404 goods and services, as a group, show a decrease of 0.4% and had an effect of -0.35 ppts on the CPI.

## Change in prices of Food & catering services in January 2022

The "Food & catering services" index showed an increase of 0.8% in January 2022, after an increase of 0.2% in December 2021. The index for "Food at home" showed an increase of 0.3% in January, as ten (10) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices increased in January 2022. The "Oils and fats" index registered the largest increase (1.8%) in January 2022. Furthermore, other significant increases were posted in the indices for "Fish and other seafood" (1.6%), "Sugar, jam, honey and other confectionery" (1.3%), "Meat" (1.0%), "Milk, cheese and eggs" (0.9%) and "Fruit" (0.7%).

The "Vegetables" (-6.5%) index registered the only decrease in January 2022.

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 4.8%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 4.9%. The "Oils and fats" index increased by 19.6%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups, while the "Vegetables" index decreased by 2.1%, the largest decrease among the "Food at home" food groups.

The index for "Food away from home" increased by 1.9% in January 2022 and has increased by 4.6% over the last twelve (12) months.

In January 2022, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed an increase in price of 0.8% compared to December 2021, and had an influence of 0.12 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced a decrease in price of 0.8%, causing an effect of -0.65 ppts on the CPI.
