

Consumer Price Index, base period June 2019 July 2022

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents the most important findings for the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of July 2022.

Consumer Price Index for the month of July 2022

The CPI for July 2022 is 104.46, an increase of 1.2% compared to the index of June 2022 (103.26) and accumulating an increase of 3.8% up to and including July of this year.

The percentage change of the CPI over the last twelve (12) months (July 2021 to July 2022) is 6.0, an increase of 4.2 percentage points (ppts) compared to the percentage change for the same period of last year (1.8%).

The period average (last 24 months) percentage change of the CPI for the periods July 2020 to July 2021 and July 2021 to July 2022 is 3.7%, an increase of 5.1 ppts compared to the period average percentage change over the periods July 2019 to July 2020 and July 2020 to July 2021 (-1.4%).

During this month, eight (8) of the twelve (12) sectors registered increases in prices. The increases that had the greatest influence on the CPI were registered for the "Transport" (3.7%) and "Recreation and culture" (4.5%) sectors, which contributed with an effect of 0.56 and 0.42 ppts, respectively. The increases in the remaining sectors had an effect of 0.35 ppts on the CPI of July 2022.

Aforementioned increases were partially offset mainly by a decrease in the index for the "Household operation" (-1.5%) sector, causing an effect of -0.14 ppts. The decreases in the remaining sectors had an effect of -0.03 ppts on the CPI of July 2022.

The increase in the "Transport" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Operation of personal transport equipment" (3.3%), which contributed to an effect of 0.33. The increase in the "Recreation and culture" sector was mainly due to an increase in the category "Holidays" (6.9%), which contributed to an effect of 0.18 ppts.

The decrease in the "Household operation" sector was mainly due to a decrease in the category "Furniture, furnishings, carpets and other floor coverings" (-19.3%), which contributed to an effect of -0.22 ppts.

Consumption basket


The consumption basket of the CPI consists of 408 goods and services. Compared to June 2022, 53.2% of these products had an increase in price, causing an effect of 1.73 ppts, while 30.1% showed a decrease, contributing to an effect of -0.57 ppts and the remaining 16.7% had no change in price. The prices of goods increased by 1.6% and caused an influence of 0.96 ppts. The prices of services increased by 0.5% had an influence of 0.21 ppts on the CPI of July 2022.

Core inflation

The CPIC (core inflation) - CPI excluding the effect of energy and food – was 2.2% in July 2022. The energy index - which consists of the products: electricity, water, gasoline and diesel – was 9.5%. The food index showed an increase of 6.1%.

Subsistence level

The subsistence level for a household consisting of two (2) adults and two (2) children (aged 0-14 years) in July 2022 is Afl. 5,124, an increase of Afl. 309 compared to July 2021 (Afl. 4,815). The subsistence level for a single adult household is Afl. 2,440, an increase of Afl. 147 compared to July 2021 (Afl. 2,293).

Change in prices of crude oil, utilities, gasoline and diesel in July 2022

The prices of utilities (electricity and water), gasoline and diesel are for the greater part determined by international crude oil prices. In July 2022 the average price per barrel of crude oil (US\$ 103.21) had a decrease of US\$ 12.08 (-10.5%) compared to June 2022 (US\$ 115.29).

The prices of electricity and water did not change compared to June 2022. Subsequently, the average electricity price per household remained at Afl. 240.09, while the average price of water per household remained at Afl. 137.05.

In July 2022 the price of gasoline registered an increase of Afl. 14.50 cents (4.5%) and had an effect of 0.29 ppts on the CPI. The price of diesel registered an increase of Afl. 22.40 cents (7.7%) and had an effect of 0.04 ppts on the CPI of July 2022.

In July 2022, utilities, gasoline and diesel as a group showed an increase in price of 1.9% compared to June 2022, and had an influence of 0.32 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining 404 goods and services, as a group, show an increase of 1.0% and had an effect of 0.84 ppts on the CPI.

Change in prices of Food & catering services in July 2022

The "Food & catering services" index showed an increase of 0.7% in July 2022, after an increase of 1.0% in June 2022. The index for "Food at home" showed an increase of 0.8% in July, as ten (10) of the eleven (11) "Food at home" indices increased in July 2022. The "Potatoes and other tubers" index registered the largest increase (13.8%) in July 2022. Furthermore, other significant increases were posted in the indices for "Vegetables" (1.3%), "Fish and other seafood" (1.2%) and "Bread and cereals" (1.2%).

The only decrease was registered in the index of "Fruit" (-0.6%).

Over the last twelve (12) months, the "Food & catering services" has increased by 9.5%. The "Food at home" index showed an increase of 11.0%, where all of the "Food at home" indices increased over the last year. The "Oils and fats" index increased by 22.3%, the largest increase among the "Food at home" food groups. Furthermore, other significant increases were posted in the indices for "Potatoes and other tubers" (21.4%), "Meat" (14.7%), "Fruit" (13.1%), "Fish and other seafood" (12.4%) and "Milk, cheese and eggs" (12.0%).

The index for "Food away from home" increased by 0.3% in July 2022 and has increased by 6.0% over the last twelve (12) months.

In July 2022, "Food at home" and "Food away from home" as a group showed an increase in price of 0.7% compared to June 2022, and had an influence of 0.10 ppts on the CPI, while the remaining goods and services, as a group, experienced an increase in price of 1.3%, causing an effect of 1.06 ppts on the CPI.
