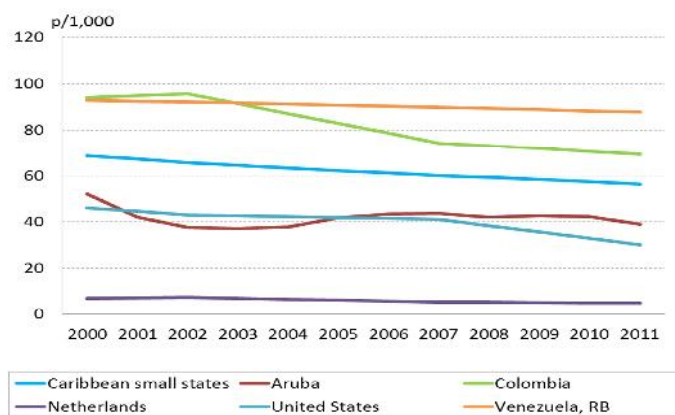

The vast majority – 90 per cent -- of the pregnant adolescents in the developing world are married. But for far too many of these girls, pregnancy has little to do with informed choice. 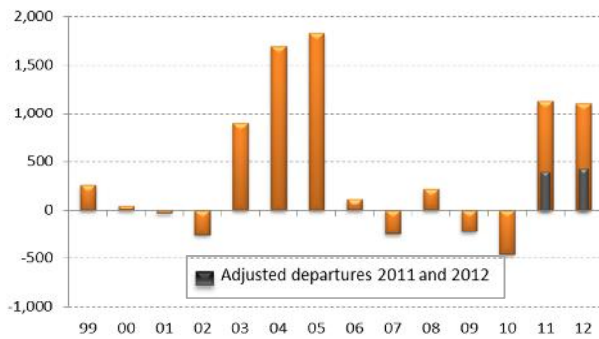
- Births to teenage mothers accounted for 12 percent of all births in 2012. Comparing births to teenage mothers during the first half year, in 2011 their share was 13 percent of all births and 11 percent in both 2012 and 2013.
- In 2013, the majority of these teenage mothers, 72 percent, were aged 18 and 19 years.
- Thirty two percent of the teenage mothers were born in Aruba and another 32 percent was born in the Netherlands Antilles.
- Forty one percent of the fathers were born in the Netherlands Antilles and of 17 percent of the fathers their country of birth was not known.
- Sixty four percent of babies born to teenage mothers were born out of wedlock.

Figure 2 Net migration (and adjusted net migration) in absolute numbers



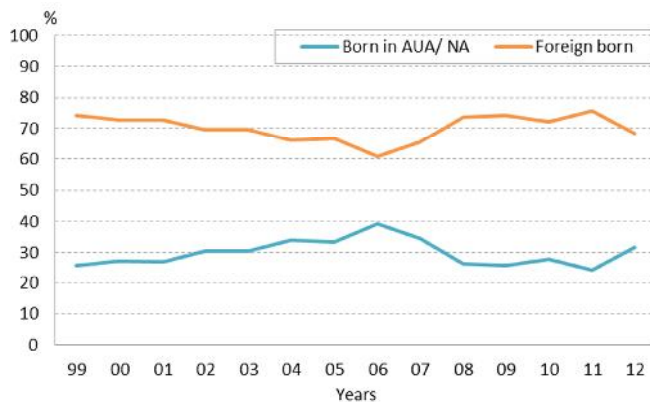

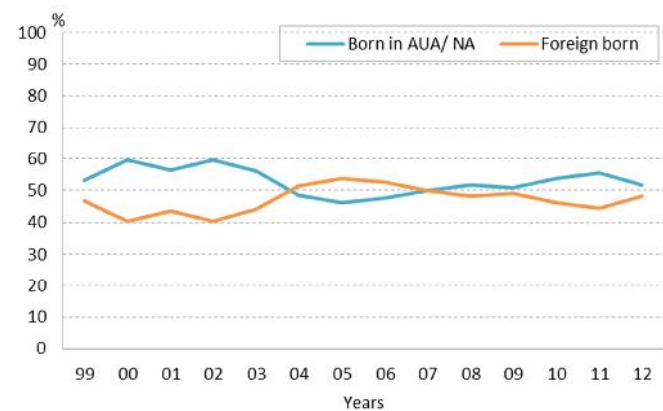

Population estimates for Aruba are based on the latest census data, natural growth and net migration. Between the 2000 and 2010 censuses adjustments were made to compensate the underreporting in the number of departures. This adjustment is by no means defining for the next intercensal period. However, as seen in figure 2, the net migration for 2011 and 2012 are considerably higher than the previous adjusted period. Applying the 2000-2010 adjustment factor to 2011 and 2012, the average emigration would be 411 persons instead of 1, 118 persons.
